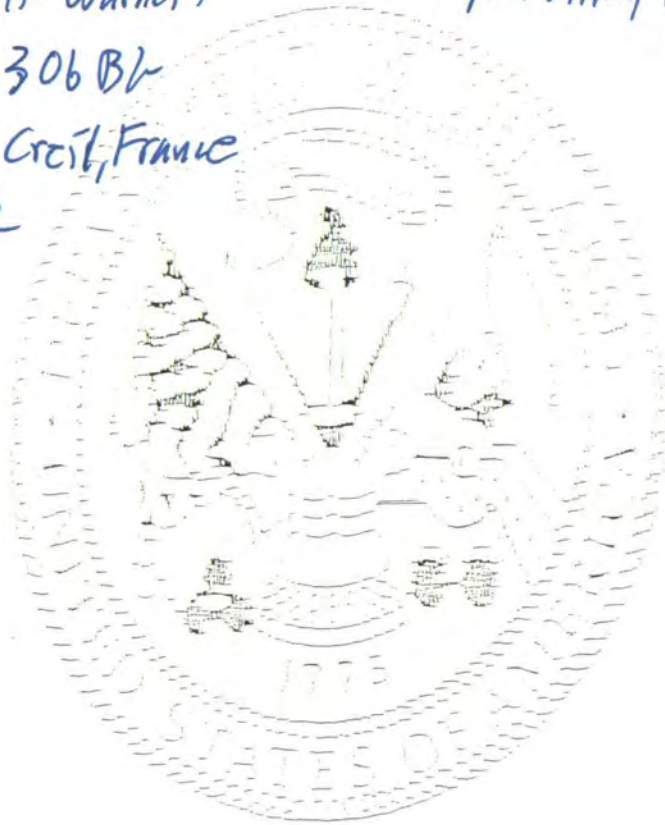

The people of the United States, through the Congress have authorized the disinterment and final burial of the heroic dead of World War II. The Quartermaster General of the Army has been entrusted with this sacred responsibility to the honored dead. The records of the War Department indicate that you may be the nearest relative of the above-named deceased, who gave his life in the service of his country.

The enclosed pamphlets, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," and "American Cemeteries," explain the disposition, options and services made available to you by your Government. I have learned via of the newspapers, that the U.S. Gov't. planned to bring bodies of U.S. Servicemen who died or were killed overseas back to the States.

My son ^{29³} Sgt. Carl H. Warheit, 13038206 was killed in action 20 December 1942 on a mission to Romilly France ~~and~~ fell near the vicinity of Cril France and buried there.

April of this year his body was disinterred and buried in an American Cemetery at Neuen-Mulm, France. The official designation of the cemetery is Solaro Cemetery, Number 1, Neuen-Mulm, France, Grave #16, Row #1, Plot G.

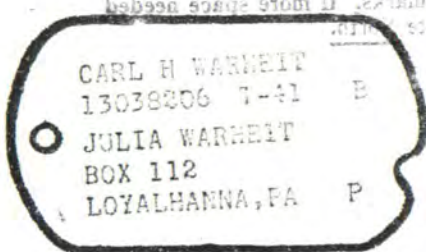

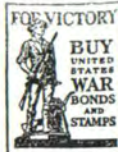
