

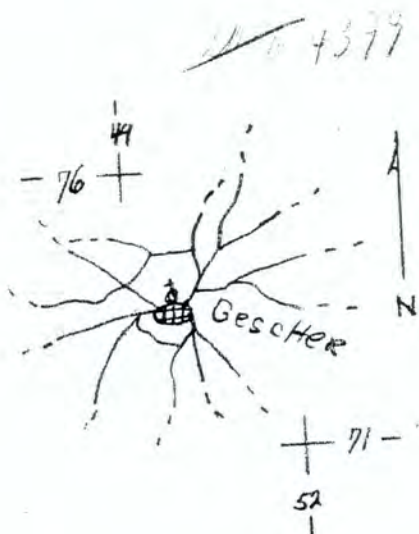

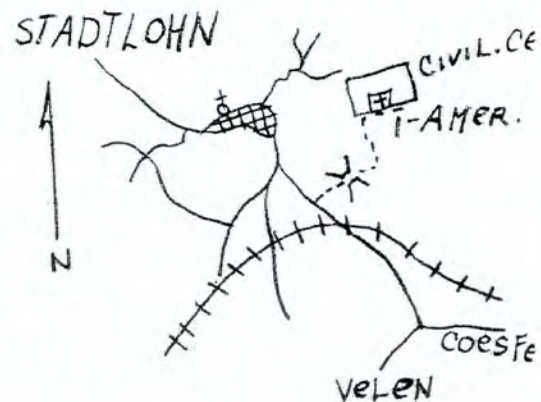

Your letter pertaining to the remains of your husband, the late First Lieutenant Andy T. Wilson, has come to my attention.

The "Request for Disposition of Remains" forms pertaining to the US Military Cemetery Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium, where the remains of your husband are now buried, have not yet been mailed to the next of kin of the heroic dead.

The Return of World War II Dead Program provides for the return of the deceased to their next of kin in a predetermined scheduled sequence of the cemeteries in which they are now buried. Efficient and rapid accomplishment of this tremendous program requires not only close adherence to mailing schedules for the Disposition Forms made in agreement with the scheduled cemetery sequence but also accurate verification of all vital records of every decedent prior to the mailing of the Disposition Form. When verification for each cemetery is completed, the Forms are mailed well in advance of the scheduled processing of the cemetery.

I fully understand your natural anxiety and impatience, and assure you that you will receive your Disposition Form in ample time for complete satisfactory expression and fulfillment of your desires for the final disposition of your beloved husband.

Please do not hesitate to call upon us at any time if you believe we can assist you further.

Dear Mr. Wilson:

Your letter concerning your son, the late First Lieutenant Andy T. Wilson, has been received in this office.

The official report of burial discloses that the remains of your son were originally interred in Gescher, Germany, the place in which he met his death but were later disinterred and moved to a more suitable site where constant care of the grave can be assured by our Forces in the field.

The report further discloses that the body was identified by his identification tag and his remains are now interred in Plot J, Row 6, Grave 131, in the United States Military Cemetery, Neuville-en-Condroz, located eighteen miles northeast of Liege, Belgium.

You may be assured that your son's grave can be identified inasmuch as it is marked with a Cross bearing his name and serial number.

This office has no knowledge of an individual to whom you may write concerning the location of your son's grave. However, since his remains are interred in one of our established military cemeteries the grave will have perpetual care.

A copy of your letter has been forwarded to The Adjutant General, Washington 25, D. C., for direct reply relative to the circumstances surrounding the death of your son, as that official has jurisdiction over matters of this nature.

Dear Mrs. Wilson:

Reference is made to a letter from this office dated 18 September 1946, in which you were advised that a letter would be forthcoming to your letter regarding your husband.

The official report of burial discloses that the remains of your husband were originally interred in Geseher, Germany, but were later disinterred and moved to a more suitable site where constant care of grave can be assured by our Forces in the field.

The report of burial further discloses that the remains of your husband are now interred in Plot J, Row 6, Grave 131, in the United States Military Cemetery, Neuville-en-Dendroz, located eighteen miles northeast of Liege, Belgium.

In view of the fact that Congress has approved legislation which will permit the repatriation of all American dead who have lost their lives while serving overseas, the War Department does not contemplate the sponsoring of pilgrimages to the American Cemeteries abroad. At the proper time, the legal next of kin will be contacted by this office in order to obtain their wishes regarding the final disposition of the remains.

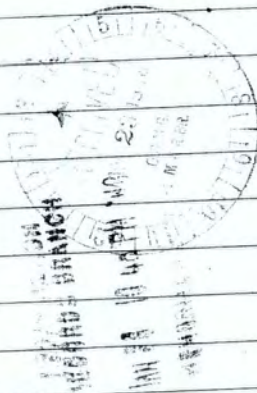

After having written the War Department gone through the Red Cross and having our congressman try to obtain information I am writing you in hopes you might be able to help me.

I have received the same answer from all sources that I have attempted to obtain information from about my husband. All the information which the War Department has given me is that my husband radioed he was going to crash land approximately ten miles west of the Rhine. That information was received last May after my husband and crew went down on March 24, 1945.

Four of my husband's crew were reported definitely identified three were found with those four but were not identified. The other two still listed as missing until Jan. 15, 1946 when my husband was reported K.I.A.

We have learned through friends that the seven boys found are buried in Margraten, Holland.

I want to know the following questions and I hope you will obtain the answers for me. I think it only fair that the one's who lost loved one's overseas know the circumstances of that persons death and where he is buried.

1. Was my husband identified and if so how?
2. If he was found with the other boys who were found with the plane soon after his crash, why wasn't he identified then?
3. Where is my husband buried?
4. Did the plane burn?

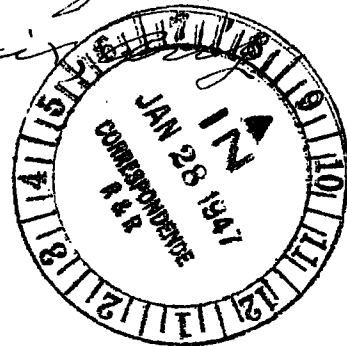


