

Your letter pertaining to the remains of your son, the late Second Lieutenant Delmar D. Pollock, has come to my attention.

For your information I am inclosing a copy of our letter advising you of the recovery of the remains of your son which was forwarded to you at the above address on 14 June 1949.

Matters pertaining to your son's insurance are under the jurisdiction of the Veterans Administration, Washington 25, D. C., therefore, a copy of your letter has been forwarded to that office for appropriate action.

I would like to mention that necessary action has been taken to comply with your request to have the remains of your son returned to the United States for burial in a private cemetery.

We are desirous that you be furnished information concerning the resting place of the remains of your son, the late Second Lieutenant Delmar D. Pollock.

The official report of burial has been received and discloses that the remains of your son were originally buried in the Longuenesse British Military Cemetery, St. Omer, France, but were later disinterred by our American Graves Registration Personnel, properly identified, and reinterred in Plot J, Row 4, Grave 77, in the U. S. Military Cemetery St. Andre, located forty-eight miles west of Paris, France.

The report further indicates that these remains have now been casked and are being held at a U. S. Military Cemetery in France, pending disposition instructions from the next of kin, either for return to the United States or for permanent burial in an overseas cemetery.

There are inclosed informational pamphlets regarding the Return of World War II Dead Program, including a Disposition Form on which the father may indicate his desires in this matter. Upon receipt of the properly completed form, you may be assured that the Department of the Army will attempt to comply with his instructions as indicated thereon.

In order that this office may take immediate action toward the final disposition of the remains of your son, it is urged that the father complete the inclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains", and mail it to this office, without delay, in the inclosed self-addressed envelope which requires no postage.

This office promised to communicate with you upon receipt of information regarding the burial of the remains of your former husband, the late Second Lieutenant Delmar D. Pollock.

The official report of burial has been received and discloses that the remains of your former husband were originally buried in the Longuenesse British Military Cemetery, St. Omer, France, but were later disinterred by our American Graves Registration Personnel, properly identified, and reinterred in Plot J, Row 4, Grave 77, in the U. S. Military Cemetery St. Andre, located forty-eight miles west of Paris, France.

The report further indicates that these remains have now been casketed and are being held at a U. S. Military Cemetery in France, pending disposition instructions from the next of kin, either for return to the United States or for permanent burial in an overseas cemetery.

The Secretary of the Army, pursuant to the authority granted under Public Law 368, 80th Congress, has established the precedence of relatives eligible to designate the disposition of the remains of a decedent. Accordingly, the widow has the prior disposition right unless she was separated, divorced, or has remarried. In either of these events, the disposition right reverts to the parent of the decedent, the father having precedence over the mother.

As much as you have remarried, we are forwarding Mr. Pollock full information regarding the Return of World War II Dead Program, together with a form on which he may indicate his desires in this matter.





X-629 was recovered from grave 176, British Military Cemetery, St. Omer, France. Place of death is given as St. Omer, France; cause of death is given as plane crash; German Green Card attached to Burial Report shows date of death as 4 March 1944.

German record KU 1074 indicates that A/C 42-38169 crashed 5 km west of Dunkirk, 4 March 1944. Of a crew of ten (10) men, five (5) were killed. Three (3) identified crew members are buried in USMC St. Andre. These casualties were previously interred in St. Omer British Military Cemetery in graves 173, 174 and 175. Dulag Record further shows that the casualties of A/C 42-38169 were interred in graves 174, 175 and 176, however, upon disinterment from St. Omer, the casualty reported in grave 175 was found to be buried in grave 173; and the casualty reported in grave 176 was found to be buried in grave 175.

S/Sgt. Jay W. Summers, 39677686, an unresolved casualty of this aircraft cannot be associated with any of the other unidentified cases from St. Omer British Military Cemetery.

1. The following named personnel of the Air Corps, 331st Bombardment Squadron, 94th Bombardment Group, were reported missing in action, while in flying pay status, on 4 March 1944, over Germany by ETO Shipment Number 009, and were presumed dead as of 5 March 1945, under the provisions of the Missing Persons Act by SR&D Case No. 2397:

2d Lt.	Pollock, Delmar D.	0-742 011
S Sgt.	Summers, Jay W.	39 677 686

2. Missing Air Crew Report number 2998, dated 8 March 1944, states that the subject persons, and eight others, comprised the crew of B-17G (Flying Fortress) aircraft number 42-38169, that departed Station 468, (England), 4 March 1944, on an operational mission to northwestern Germany. There was fire in the radio compartment of the subject plane when it was last sighted at 1045 hours on that day, at coordinates 51° 20' N - 02° 40' E (approximately), as it dived into the undercast. Two crew members were observed bailing out. The report states there was no flak or enemy aircraft in the vicinity. Lieutenant Pollock was the pilot of the plane and Sergeant Summers was tail gunner.

3. The present status of the balance of the crew members is as follows:

4. An "Evaders and Escapees Casualty Questionnaire", dated 3 February 1945, which was completed by Staff Sergeant Kenneth O. Kirker, 15377588, as requested in a letter from this office dated 20 January 1945, file AG 704 (20 Jan 45) PC-S, contains the following pertinent information:

"1. Plane crashed on 4 March 1944 at a very small town, southeast of Dunkirk, France, approximately two miles away in Spycher, France, at 9:00 a.m.

"2. The only damage that I know of was fire in No. 1 engine. ***

"6. I did not see the plane hit the ground, but French civilians told me that it did not explode, but burned. ***

"8. I was told by French civilians that one man in the cockpit was killed, one in the ball turret and also one waist gunner. I was also informed that the tail gunner had attempted to escape and his shroud

lines or chute had entangled in the plane's structure and he was dragged with the tail to the ground. As the French civilians told me, he (the tail gunner) was killed. I was told only of this crew member's position -- no other means of identification was available. ***

"11. *** Our target was Berlin and the above incident occurred just outside of Dunkirk, approximately five miles northwest of Dunkirk, and at this time encountered our first flak. *** I hit the ground at approximately 9:15 a.m. and from information obtained from the French, I found out that one man in the cockpit, the radio operator, the ball turret gunner and the right waist gunner, were killed. However, that is from information obtained from the French. I also found out from the French that the tail gunner had attempted to bail out and his chute shroud lines or harness had caught on the tail and he was unable to free himself and went down with the ship."

5. Attached to the Missing Air Crew Report are Casualty Questionnaires submitted by three of the returned crew members, and the information set forth below has been extracted from these statements.

a. Staff Sergeant Walter G. Stevenson, states his belief that Staff Sergeant Summers, had bailed out and that he had been shot by the Germans while descending. He furnished no information regarding Lieutenant Pollock. He also stated that the aircraft fell about 5 km east of Dunkirk and that the back half of the ship fell at one point and the wing and nose fell about one half mile away.

b. 2d Lt. (former Flt. O) Ralph Candiotti, stated that he was blown out of the ship and that five others besides himself bailed out. He expressed the belief that Lieutenant Pollock was trapped at the controls while attempting to bring the ship out of a spiral and was in the ship when it blew up. He furnished no information regarding S Sgt. Summers.

c. 2d Lt. Bennie Zak also states that he was blown out of the plane when it exploded and that two others were blown out. He and two companions who were blown out parachuted to the ground. He also stated that three other crew members bailed out, including S Sgt Summers, who bailed out over the English Channel. Lieutenant Zak expressed the belief that S Sgt Summers landed in the water and drowned. Lieutenant Zak stated that Lieutenant Pollock did not bail out and that he was in the plane when it exploded. He reports that pieces of the plane landed near St. Omer, France.

6. Captured German record KU 1074, reports the downing of the subject aircraft near St. Omer, France, 5 km west of Dunkirk, on 4 March 1944 at 1047 hours. All of the crew members except Lieutenant Pollock and S Sgt Kirker are listed upon this report. This German record indicates the capture of four of the crew and the death of three members as set forth in paragraph three of this review. No status is shown for S Sgt Summers, whose grade and last name is listed.

German Record AV 650/44 reports the downing of the aircraft by antiaircraft fire 8 km southwest of Dunkirk, and lists the three known deceased crew members.

7. The territory in France over which the subject persons became missing in action was German controlled at the time of their disappearance.

8. The Office of the Quartermaster General, Memorial Division, has advised that there are no Burial Reports or information concerning the subject persons in that office at this time.

9. The subject personnel, and eight others, comprised the crew of a Flying Fortress on an operational mission to northwestern Germany which crashed approximately five miles northwest of Dunkerque, France, near St. Omer. According to the captured German records the plane was downed as a result of antiaircraft fire. One crew member evaded capture and seven of the crew were accounted for within four months after their disappearance, four as prisoners of war and three as killed in action. The crew member who evaded capture has furnished information to the effect that French civilians informed him that the plane burned; that a man in the cockpit was killed and that the tail gunner's parachute became entangled in the plane's structure, and he was dragged to the ground and killed. The man in the cockpit would have been Lieutenant Pollock, the pilot, since the co-pilot was reported as captured, and S Sgt Summers was the tail gunner of the crew. Information submitted by three of the returned crew members indicate that Lieutenant Pollock did not bail out and that S Sgt Summers was seen to bail out of the ship. They report that the ship exploded; that three crew members who were blown from the ship survived; that three others, two of whom survived parachuted from the plane, and indicate that S Sgt Summers was the third parachutist. The remains of the plane are reported to have fallen in two sections, one half mile apart.

10. The foregoing appears to indicate that the subject aircraft caught fire, exploded in the air, crashed in two sections and burned. It is also apparent that on the basis of information received from returned crew members, Lieutenant Pollock crashed with the plane and that S Sgt Summers made an unsuccessful attempt to parachute but that his parachute became entangled with the plane's structure or that he landed in the English Channel. The exact details surrounding the fate of these two men may never become known. However, it appears there could exist no possibility that they may have survived in the German occupied territory where the crash occurred, and remained unreported for over five years. It therefore appears reasonable to conclude that the subject persons were killed when their plane crashed near St. Omer, France.

11. It is recommended, therefore, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act, the foregoing information be accepted as an official report of death, and that a casualty report be initiated stating that the persons named in paragraph 1, above, were killed in action, in flying pay status, on 4 March 1944, when their plane exploded and crashed near St. Omer, France. The systemat will be processed in accordance with Paragraph 2b, Operations Bulletin 35, 1945. The casualty report and official report of death will include the following statement:

Finding of Death has been issued previously under Section 5, Public Law 490, 7 March 1942, as amended, showing presumed date of death as 5 March 1945. This "Report of Death" based on information received since that date, is issued in accordance with Section 9 of said Act and its effect on prior payments and settlements is as provided in Section 9.


