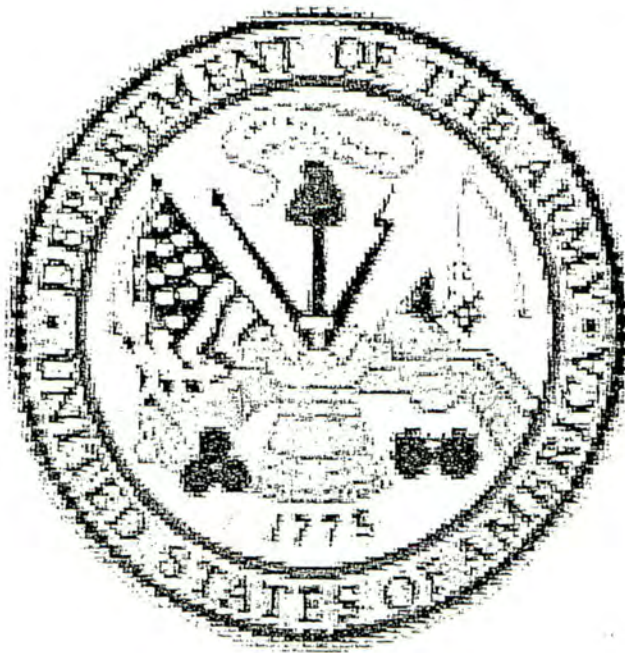

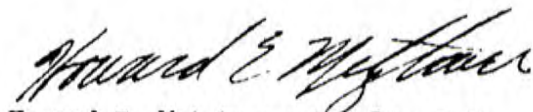

1. See Case attached. A Thorough Search has been made of Moselle (Moselle) France and the surrounding Communes and we were unable to locate an isolated grave for Lt. Warren A. Jones.

2. The only isolated grave of an American in this area was at Abreschwiller (Moselle) France. This was an American Flyer, Eugene L. Jones O-774178 whose plane crashed in the forest of Abreschwiller. From the information received he was first buried in a shallow grave by Americans and later reburied by French civilians at the same spot which was the scene of the crash. There was no mention of Germans recording the burial when we investigated this case.

3. All that can be done has been done in the investigation of this case. In my opinion it should be closed unless more definite information can be obtained from the German records.

Dear Mrs. Jones:

I am writing to you in reference to your son who gave his life in the service of his Country during the European conflict.

In an effort to furnish the next of kin with all available details concerning casualties among our personnel, the Army Air Forces recently completed the translation of several volumes of captured German records.

In regard to First Lieutenant Warren A. Jones, these records indicate that he was killed when his fighter plane crashed, about 11:30 a.m., 17 November 1944, approximately six miles southwest of Saarburg (49° 37' N - 6° 32' E), Germany. These records further state that Lieutenant Jones was interred in the Municipal Cemetery of Landingen.

The Quartermaster General in his capacity as Chief, American Graves Registration Service, is charged with the responsibility of notifying the legal next of kin concerning grave locations of members of the military forces who are killed or die outside the continental limits of the United States. If the report of your son's burial has not been confirmed and you have not been notified by the Quartermaster General, that official will furnish you definite information immediately upon receipt of the official report of interment from the Commanding General of the Theater concerned.

May the knowledge of your son's valuable contribution to our cause sustain you in your bereavement.

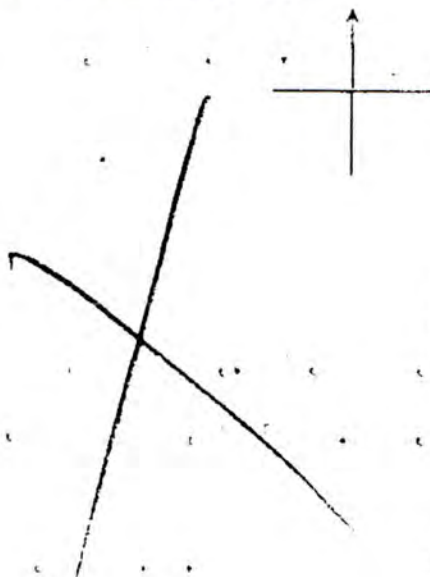

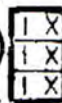
