According to Army records and statement of the Flight Leader, your son was killed on 18 March 1945, when his P-47 aircraft, number 42-28443, failed to pull up after making a strafing pass on enemy trucks in the vicinity of Luedenscheid, Germany.

In September 1947, a report was received from the British War Graves Commission concerning the remains of an American, identified by uniform only, which were found in the Loh Cemetery near Luedenscheid. According to the Germans, only British flyers had been buried in this cemetery during the war. These remains were recovered from a grave which had been marked "Unknown English Flyer" and were taken to the United States Military Cemetery, Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium, as an Unknown since there were no means through which immediate identification could be established.

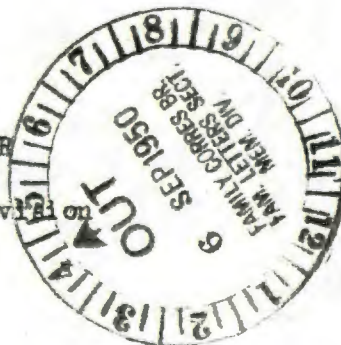
Subsequent investigation and interrogation of German civilians familiar with the incident, revealed that the remains had been reburied by the Germans as British in the Loh Cemetery after being removed from the Bruningshausen Cemetery, also in the vicinity of Luedenscheid, where they were initially interred on 19 March 1945, the day after the crash of a fighter plane. Upon re-opening the initial grave in the Bruningshausen Cemetery, an identification tag bearing your son's name and serial number was found.

A careful examination of the remains by technicians skilled in identification procedures resulted in an excellent comparison of the detailed dental and physical characteristics with that recorded in your son's Army records. Therefore, after a complete review of the nature and substance of the evidence, the identification of the remains as those of your son was concluded.

Dear Mr. Myers:

The "Request for Disposition of Remains" form which you executed in regard to the final interment of the remains of your son, the late Flight Officer Warren G. Myers, has been received and accepted by our office.

You may be assured that the Department of the Army will comply with your desire to have the remains of your son permanently interred in a United States Military Cemetery overseas.

I regret to advise you that the United States Military Cemetery Hamm, Luxembourg, is closed to future interments and disinterments. However, the United States Military Cemetery Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium, where the remains of your son were previously interred, has been designated as a permanent resting place for our heroic dead of World War II. Since this cemetery has available grave space, the remains of your loved one will be reverently reinterred therein.

All necessary arrangements for burial, military honors and religious services will be completed and provided by the Government. Please rest assured that every detail will be accomplished with all the reverence and dignity traditional for our honored dead.

I sincerely regret that I am unable to furnish you with the approximate date on which the remains of your son will be permanently interred. When this has been accomplished, however, you will be furnished with particulars regarding final interment including the exact location of the grave. The flag used to drape the casket of your son during the burial ceremony will also be sent to you.

Your natural concern regarding the identification of your son's remains is, indeed, understandable. In order that you may be informed of the facts upon which identification was based, I am presenting herewith a brief summary of your son's case.

Dear Mrs. Myers:

Reference is made to the recent letter from The Adjutant General's Office, Washington 25, D. C., in which you were regretfully informed that the records of the Department of the Army were being amended to show that your son, Flight Officer Warren G. Myers, service number T-63 277, Air Corps, was killed in action 18 March 1945, near Ludenscheid, Germany.

Subsequent to the writing of the above-mentioned letter, a report was received in this office from the American Graves Registration Service, stating the remains of your son were recovered as an unknown and interred in the United States Military Cemetery, Neuville en Condroz, Belgium, where positive identification was made. It is regretted that the report contained no further information as to the circumstances of his death. You will, however, receive a letter from The Quartermaster General concerning the final disposition of your son's remains.

Dear Mr. Myers:

We are desirous that you be furnished information concerning the resting place of the remains of your son, the late Flight Officer Warren G. Myers.

The official report of burial has been received and discloses that the remains of your son were originally buried in the Civilian Cemetery at Bruninghausen, Germany, but were later disinterred by our American Graves Registration Personnel, and reinterred in Plot EE, Row 3, Grave 66, in the United States Military Cemetery Neuville-en-Condroz, located nine miles southwest of Liege, Belgium.

The remains have been properly identified, casketed, and are being held in above ground storage pending disposition instructions from the next of kin, either for return to the United States or for permanent burial in an overseas cemetery.

There are inclosed informational pamphlets regarding the Return of World War II Dead Program, including a Disposition Form on which you may indicate your desires in this matter. Upon receipt of the properly completed form, you may be assured that the Department of the Army will attempt to comply with your instructions as indicated thereon.

In order that this office may take immediate action toward the final disposition of the remains of your son, it is urged that you complete the inclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains", and mail it to this office, without delay, in the inclosed self-addressed envelope which requires no postage.

May I extend my sincere sympathy in your great loss.

SUBJECT: Report of Death

1. ETO Casualty Shipment No. 088 reported that Flt O Warren G. Myers, T 063277, AC, 509th Fighter Squadron, 405th Fighter Group, was missing in action, in flying pay status, over Germany, on 18 March 1945. Under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act, a Finding of Death was issued for Flight Officer Myers, setting the presumed date of his death as 19 March 1946 (SR&D No. 5586).

2. According to Missing Air Crew Report No. 13134 Flight Officer Myers, piloting P-47 No. 42-28443, took part in an armed reconnaissance mission to the Dortmund area on 18 March 1945. An eyewitness account attached to the report states that about one mile west of Ludenscheid, Germany, the flight went down to strafe traffic on the highway, that Myers failed to pull up sufficiently after the strafing pass and his plane crashed into the side of a hill and exploded. Flight Officer Myers was not seen to leave the aircraft.

3. Captured German records for the period contain no reference to Flight Officer Myers. He was never reported as a prisoner of war by any source. To date, The Quartermaster General has not identified his remains.

4. It would appear, from the circumstances surrounding the loss of Flight Officer Myers, that there is no reasonable hope that he was not killed in the crash and subsequent explosion of his aircraft. The plane was indubitably proceeding at high speed and at a very low altitude when it crashed, both of which factors would militate against his survival. Furthermore, nearly five years have elapsed since the loss of Flight Officer Myers and no information which would tend to support a belief that he survived the crash has been discovered by the intensive searches conducted in the area. The circumstances of his loss, then, furnish reasonably conclusive evidence of the death of Flight Officer Myers on 18 March 1945.

5. It is recommended, therefore, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act, the foregoing information be accepted as an official report of death, and that a casualty report be initiated stating that the person named in paragraph one, above, was killed in action, in flying pay status, on 18 March 1945, near Ludenscheid, Germany.

1. Reference is made to Report of Reburial for Unknown X-6859, USMC Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium, Plot EE, Row 3, Grave 66.

2. Corrected Burial Report has been received identifying the above mentioned deceased as F/O Warren G. Myers, T-63277, based on date, Place of death and grave marker.

3. The Narrative Report, dated 21 September 1947, attached to Report of Reburial states that the cross on the grave in Loh Cemetery in which X-6859 was buried was marked "Unbekannter Engl. Flieger, 18.3.1945". However, the Disinterring Narrative Report indicates no grave marker was found when remains were disinterred.

4. It is further noted that statements of Artur Schulte and Fritz Klever reveal the body of the deceased flier was buried in a casket in the cemetery at Brueninghausen, while the statement of Peter Kimm, who disinterred the remains of Unknown X-6859 from Brueninghausen, indicates the remains were wrapped in a parachute.

5. In view of the above mentioned discrepancies, it is requested that subject case be reinvestigated and this Office notified of results.

F/O Myers was the sole occupant of P-47 Aircraft #42-28443 which crashed 1 mile W. of Luedenscheid, Germany on 18 March 1945. The tooth chart and physical characteristics of Unknown X-6859 compare very favorably with A. C. records of F/O Myers.

Upon return to this Headquarters, I discovered that, during my absence a Basic Document, (AGRC case # 9731) had been received concerning the reported casualty of P/O Warren C. Myers, T-63277. MACR # R-44 reported his P-47 to have crashed near Ludenscheid on 18 March, 1945 at 16.30 hrs. This corresponds exactly with information obtained in my investigation.

CONCLUSION:

It is concluded that remains buried in Loh cemetery are those of P/O Warren C. Myers.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the above mentioned flier be disinterred and sent to CIP. to determine his exact identity. It is further recommended that the first place of burial in the Bruningshausen Cemetery be checked to ascertain whether or not any clue concerning the identification as teeth or pieces of clothes with markings can be traced, since one witness stated that body was originally buried in a casket and the witness who transferred remains from Bruningshausen to Loh stated that he found remains interred wrapped in a parachute.

Report of investigation and findings :

1.) I interviewed the former burgermeister Herr Schulte who informed me that about half past four in the afternoon of 18/3/45 three fighter aircraft were attacking a lorry on the main road through Paddensiepen, when one of them crashed into the side of a house. Pieces of the aircraft were still lying in a nearby wood where they had been taken later. I went with him to the spot and found various pieces of what appeared to have been a single-eng. fighter. There was a metal four bladed propeller an Oléo Leg with the inscription: 8123 C 2 RM. G.P.A.Inc. a piece of a rubber with the words "U.S. Rubber Co." and a metal plate with "Republic Aviation" on it. This lead me to suppose that the aircraft was a "Republic Aviation Thunderbolt".

2.) I interviewed the occupant of a house nearby, who had seen the crash. He said he was not sure of the colour of the aircraft but thought it might have been a silvery paint. He had heard it said that it was American, but there was no proof.

3.) The pilot was taken and buried in the Military Cemetery near Loh. A cross was erected bearing the inscription "Unbekannter Englischer Flieger" 18/3/45. During exhumation of all the supposed RAF graves in this cemetery by Captain Butcher of 29 GCU., the body in question was found to have been wearing American uniform. Upon this discovery which was witnessed by myself, the grave was immediately closed and the cross re-erected.

4.) My conclusion is that the crash was undoubtedly an American one and the information should be passed on to the American authorities. The grave is situated next to two graves of French soldiers on the right hand side of the approach up to a large monument to the dead of the 1914 - 18 war.

S t a t e m e n t

I, Artur Schulte, former burgermeister of the Community of Luedenscheid - Land, state hereby that a one-engined plane, presumably of American origin hit the house 127 III Peddensiepen while strafing a truck from the fire-brigade between 1600 hrs and 1700 hours and was destroyed completely. The plane came down in the garden nearby and exploded, so that the wrecked parts were thrown in an area of about 100 meters. From my house I saw the body of the pilot, which was only about 1 meter tall and aflame, but otherwise not dismembered. The body was thrown about 100 meters from the place of crash. I observed that the body was removed on the next day in a wooden casket. The body was removed by the camp police and some laborers of the factory 'Stahlwerke Plate' in Brueninghausen. I do not know the name of the pilot, I remember however that some official stated that the plane in question was an American plane and was flown by an American pilot.

März 1945 ein einmotoriges Flugzeug, vermutlich amerikanischer Nationalität, bei einem Tiefangriff auf ein Auto der Feuerwehr um 4 bis 5 Uhr Nachmittags gegen das Haus Peddensiepen 127 III flog und vollkommen zertrümmert wurde. Das Flugzeug fiel in den daneben liegenden Garten und explodierte, sodass die Trümmer etwa 100 Meter im Umkreis verteilt lagen. Der Pilot wurde in brennendem Zustand etwa 100 Meter von der Absturzstelle geschleudert und ich habe ihn von meinem Wohnhaus tot liegen sehen, die Leiche war nur etwa 1 Meter lang, aber vollkommen erhalten. Ich habe gesehen, dass die Leiche in einem Holzsarg einen Tag nach dem Absturz Nachmittags von der Lagerpolizei und einigen Osterarbeitern von der Firma Stahlwerke Plate, Brueninghausen abgeholt wurde. Den Namen des Piloten ist mir unbekannt, ich entsinne mich, dass damals von der Behörde erklärt wurde, es handle sich um ein amerikanisches Flugzeug, das von einem amerikanischen Flugzeugführer gesteuert wurde.

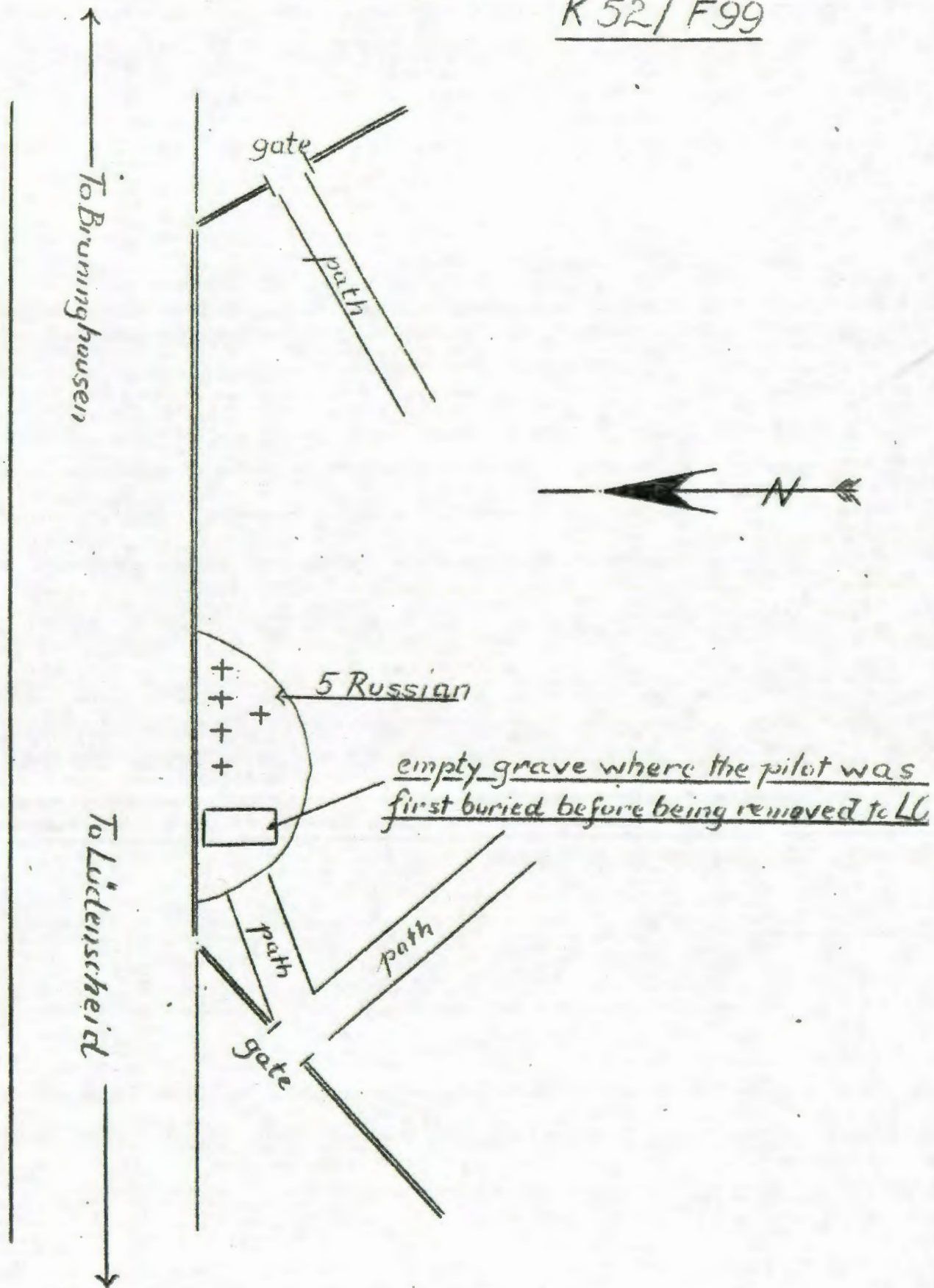

As to the crash site of the A/C in question, there is no chance of finding any clue of identification due to the fact that the plane hit a house and exploded, which caused parts of the A/C to be scattered over a wide area. All parts have been removed in the meantime and there is no evidence of any crater.

III. FINDINGS:

The following must be concluded from this investigation:

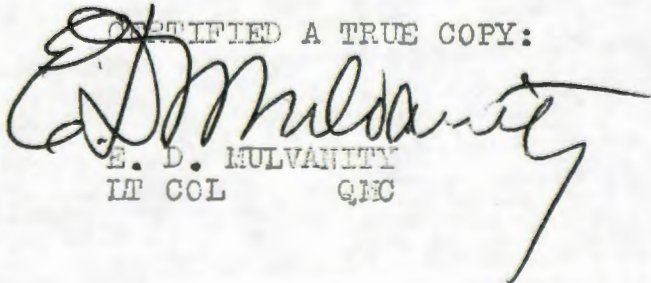
- 1) That the American pilot who crashed in Peddensiepen on 18 March 1945, is F/O Myers, T-63277.
- 2) That the transfer of the remains of this deceased who was undertaken by Mr Kimm on 18 Oct 45, was not performed with all necessary care.
- 3) That the remains recovered from the grave site at Bruninghausen are additional remains of F/O Myers.
- 4) That the remains of Unk X-6859 identified as Myers and those remains recovered during this investigation are all the remains recoverable of F/O Myers.
- 5) That the discrepancies of witnesses statements which were based more on presumptions and hearsay than on facts, do not exist any longer.

IV. RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1) That the remains recovered from cemetery in Bruninghausen during this investigation, be buried with those of Unk X-6859 (Neuv) btb F/O Myers.
- 2) That both remains, i.e. X-6859 (Neuv.) from the Loh cemetery and the remains from the Bruninghausen cemetery be associated with F/O Myers, T-63277.

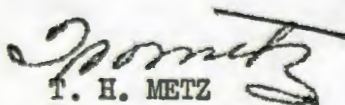

2. Corrected Burial Report has been received identifying the above mentioned deceased as F/O Warren G. Myers, T-63277, based on date, place of death and grave marker.
3. The Narrative Report, dated 21 September 1947, attached to Report of Reburial states that the cross on the grave in Loh Cemetery in which X-6859 was buried was marked "Unbekannter Engl. Flieger, 18.3.1945". However, the Disinterring Narrative Report indicates no grave marker was found when remains were disinterred.
4. It is further noted that statements of Artur Schulte and Fritz Klever reveal the body of the deceased flier was buried in a casket in the cemetery at Brueninghausen, while the statement of Peter Kimm, who disinterred the remains of Unknown X-6859 from Brueninghausen, indicates the remains were wrapped in a parachute.
