ALL MESSAGES TAKEN BY THIS COMPANY ARE SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING TERMS:

To guard against mistakes or delays, the sender of a message should order it repeated; that is, telegraphed back to the originating office for comparison. For this, one-half the unpeated message rate is charged in addition. Unless otherwise indicated on its face, this is an unpeated message and paid for as such, in consideration whereof it is agreed between the sender of the message and this Company as follows:

1. The Company shall not be liable for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any message received for transmission at the unpeated-message rate beyond the sum of five hundred dollars; nor for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for non-delivery, of any message received for transmission at the repeated-message rate beyond the sum of five thousand dollars, unless specially valued; nor in any case for delays arising from unavoidable interruption in the working of its lines.

2. In any event the Company shall not be liable for damages for mistakes or delays in the transmission or delivery, or for the non-delivery, of any message, whether caused by the negligence of its servants or otherwise, beyond the actualities, not exceeding in any event the sum of five thousand dollars, at which amount the sender of each message represents that the message is valued, unless a greater value is stated in writing by the sender thereof at the time the message is tendered for transmission, and unless the repeated-message rate is paid or agreed to be paid, and an additional charge equal to one-tenth of one per cent of the amount by which such valuation shall exceed five thousand dollars.

3. The Company is hereby made the agent of the sender, without liability, to forward this message over the lines of any other company when necessary to reach its destination.

EXPLANATION OF PART A - CIVILIAN OR PRIVATE CEMETERY

1. When the remains are delivered for interment in a civilian or private cemetery, you are responsible for paying all interment expenses. In this connection, you are entitled to the allowance mentioned in paragraph 2 below.
2. An amount not to exceed \$75 is allowed by the government toward actual interment expenses when final interment of the remains is in a private or civilian cemetery. No allowance is authorized toward interment expenses when interment is in a national or post cemetery.
3. The \$75 maximum allowance by the government toward interment expenses includes but is not limited to the payment of one or more of the following items: hearse hire from the railroad station to your home, the funeral home, church, cemetery, or any other place designated by you; vault; church services; newspaper notices; transportation for friends and relatives to and from cemetery; and the services of a funeral director.
4. Reimbursement by the government is made only to the person who paid from his personal funds the expenses of or incident to interment in a private or civilian cemetery. Receipted bills are not required to accompany this form. Any expenses over and above the \$75 maximum must be borne by the person who incurred or paid the additional expenses.

EXPLANATION OF PART B - NATIONAL OR POST CEMETERY

1. When the remains are delivered to you at government expense prior to burial in a national or post cemetery, you are responsible for all additional expenses necessary to deliver the remains from that point to the national or post cemetery grave site. However, you may be entitled to an allowance for the cost of transporting the remains from your home to the national or post cemetery grave site subject to the conditions outlined in paragraph 2, below.
2. Reimbursement of transportation expenses is allowed only when the cost to the government to deliver the remains to you is LESS than what it would have cost the government to deliver the remains direct to the national or post cemetery of final interment. However, the amount which you may be allowed (the difference between cost of delivery to you and cost of delivery by the government direct to the national or post cemetery) may not exceed the amount actually expended by you to deliver the remains to the cemetery grave site. WHETHER OR NOT YOU WILL BE GRANTED AN ALLOWANCE IS DEPENDENT UPON AN AUDIT OF THIS REQUEST. IN ANY EVENT YOU WILL BE NOTIFIED OF ANY ALLOWANCE DUE YOU BY THE OFFICE TO WHICH THIS FORM IS SENT.

3. Reimbursement by the government will be made only to the person who paid from his personal funds for transporting the remains to the national or post cemetery grave site.

4. No interment expense allowance is authorized since interment is made ultimately in a national or post cemetery.

1. The following names Air Corps personnel were reported missing in Action, in flying pay status, over Lorient, France, 17 May 1943, by Casualty Branch Message No. 144024, and were presumed dead as of 18 May 1944, under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act:



2. Missing Air Crew Report No. 15238, consisting of a letter dated 15 November 1944, from Headquarters, Army Air Forces, to Commanding General, Eighth Air Force, with ten indorsements, furnishes information that the subject enlisted men were members of the crew of B-17 aircraft No. 42-5063, which failed to return from a combat mission to Lorient, France, 17 May 1943.

a. The complete crew listing, as shown on the Report, and the present status of each member, as shown by Casualty Section records, appear below:

b. AAF Casualty Interrogation Forms dated 17 October 1945, and signed by Lieutenant Austin, are attached to the Report, and give some information regarding Lieutenants Roney and Boltz, and Sergeants Glenn and Heaney.

(1) The following statements appear on the interrogation form for Sergeant Glenn:

"While on bombing mission enemy flak and fighters caused airplane to catch on fire. Pilot gave order to bail out. At least five members of the crew bailed out, not including GLENN. GLENN'S guns had not fired for several minutes prior to order to bail out."
* * *

Sgt. Grobschmidt (waist gunner of crew) said he saw the airplane explode after he got out and he thinks Glenn was still in the plane (reliable).

A German Intelligence Officer at Dulag-Luft, Germany told Reporter that GLENN was dead, but offered no additional details (reliability unknown).

Sgt. Donaldson (radio operator of crew) said he tried to open the ball turret before he jumped, to tell GLENN to get out but the turret was jammed to such an extent that he couldn't see inside (reliable)."

(2) In regard to Sergeant Heaney Lieutenant Austin reported the following:

"HEANY'S (sic) guns had not been in operation for some minutes prior to bail out order. I attempted to contact HEANY on interphone for three or four minutes before incident but could not raise him. I believe HEANY was wounded or killed before airplane caught on fire.
* * *

Sgt. Grobschmidt (waist gunner of crew) said he saw the airplane explode after he got out and he thinks HEANY was still in the plane (reliable).

A German Intelligence Officer at Dulag-Luft, Germany told Reporter that HEANY was dead, but offered no additional details (reliability unknown)."

Regarding Lieutenants Boltz and Roney also, Lieutenant Austin stated that a German Intelligence Officer had told him that they were dead.

3. Captured German Records AV 111/43 records the capture of Lieutenant Austin and Sergeants Grobschmidt, Harker, Oberhansly, and Donaldson, and indicates that Sergeant Donaldson was wounded. U 1597 states that the remains of Lieutenant Roney washed ashore 23 June 1943, in the vicinity of Keronrieuc

(probably Kerouriec, a few miles west northwest of Lorient). The same information appears on Prisoner of War Report US/814, received 18 June 1943, in the case of the members of the crew who were captured, and on US/1054, received 28 August 1943, in the case of Lieutenant Roney. US/1535, received 29 March 1944, reported the body of Lieutenant Boltz recovered 9 June 1944, near Lorient.

4. On 26 June 1947 letters were sent to the four enlisted men who survived the crash of the plane, requesting them to submit any information which they might have regarding the fate of the subject persons. Excerpts from the replies of Messrs. Oberhansly, Grobschmidt, and Donaldson are quoted below:

Letter dated 2 July 1947, from Mr. Mark L. Oberhansly:

"We were shot down over the Bay of Biscay. The plane exploded and I saw pieces of it falling around me after I had bailed out at about twenty-seven thousand ft. All five of us were picked up out of the water, who were taken prisoner. From two to five miles from Shore. I have reason to believe that Heaney (Tail Gunner) was killed or injured before we bailed out. All of our attacks seemed to come from that direction & it was impossible to get him on the microphone."

Letter dated 7 July 1947, from Mr. Gilbert J. Grobschmidt:

"Our target was Lorient, France and on our bombing run we were hit numerous times by fighters. Our number three engine caught fire and Lt. Roney ordered the crew to bail out. When the order to bail out came we were out over the Bay of Biscay. Five of us that got out landed in the water and were picked up by French fishing boats with Germans aboard.

"It seems to me that when I bailed out all hell blew up. The ship must have exploded just as I got out. Being a waist gunner that day I kicked out the waist door and got ready to leap. Just then the plane started in a steep climb and it was hard to move. Fire was gushing past the waist door, I'm almost positive Sgt. Sinkiss was hunched beside me at the door waiting to jump also. That is when I believe the plane must have blown up.

"I do not see anything more of the missing crew members from them on. * * *

Letter (undated) from Mr. James Donaldson:

* * * * When the gunners made their first pass, Pat Heaney was hurt the worst. I went back in the waist room and at that time everyone was bailing out. That is the last I seen Glen & Simpkiss (sic). They left the ship. They were alright when they bailed out. Their parachutes could have caught on fire, because

everything was burning by that time. The Germans made one more pass. I was trying to help Heaney get another parachute on as something happened to his. He was hit again and I know was killed in the ship then. I then got out as oxygen and all was on fire. I had no sooner got out than the ship exploded and blew up. * * * It is my belief and I would say that Roney & Boltz & Heaney all three blew up with the ship as I can't see how they could get out. Heaney for sure. Glen & Simkiss got out but I never seen them since."

5. The enlisted men named in paragraph 1 were members of the crew of a Flying Fortress which was shot down over the Bay of Biscay while on a bombing mission to Lorient, France, 17 May 1943. Five survivors were picked up by French fishing boats, with Germans aboard, and two bodies washed ashore in the vicinity of Lorient. Three survivors reported that the ship exploded just after they bailed out. Mr. Donaldson was positive that Heaney was killed by enemy fire before the explosion, and Mr. Austin was told by a German Intelligence Officer that both Heaney and Glenn were dead. While Mr. Donaldson asserted that both Glenn and Simkiss bailed out, other testimony leaves room for doubt. In any event, the circumstances of the crash and of the rescue of five members of the crew lead to no other logical conclusion than that none of the others survived.

6. It is recommended, therefore, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act, the foregoing information be accepted as an Official report of death, and that a casualty report be initiated stating that the enlisted man named in paragraph 1, members of the Air Corps, were killed in action on 17 May 1943, over the Bay of Biscay, while in flying pay status. The system will be processed in accordance with Paragraph 2b, Operations Bulletin 35, 1945. The casualty report and official report of death will include the following statement:

Finding of Death has been issued previously under Section 5, Public Law 490, 7 March 1942, as amended, showing presumed date of death as 18 May 1944. This "Report of Death", based on information received since that date, is issued in accordance with Section 9 of said Act and its effect on prior payments and settlements is as provided in Section 9.

A search team found the grave of Jack C. Boltz when it searched Guidel, France. Investigation showed that he was buried by the Germans in 1943, which lead me to believe that he was a member of the A.A.F. The cemetery caretaker said that the Germans brought him to the cemetery and buried him. The caretaker could not say when, how or where Boltz was killed.

The cemetery records showed Boltz to be buried in Row 5, grave 43, that grave was marked with a cross, bearing the name Jack C. Boltz. The records contained also, the emergency addressee and the immunization shot.
