Proceedings of a Board of Officers appointed in accordance with letter AGAO-S 293.9 (27 Mar 47) D-M, War Dept, TAGO, 9 April 1947.

The Board convened pursuant to par 2, SO 133, headquarters, 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, APO 757, US Army, 20 October 1950, as amended by par 2, SO No. 136, dated 6 November 1950, at Liege, Belgium on **16 NOV. 1950**. The purpose of the Board was to determine the non-recoverability status of certain casualties now under jurisdiction of this command.

The Board reviewed report of investigation, statements of witness and other papers, contained in the files of 7887 Graves Registration Detachment EA, pertaining to the case of the following named casualty/casualties, the remains of which have not been recovered. The case records and other data considered, are attached.

SYNOPSIS: Subject Officers and seven (7) others constituted the crew of a B-17 aircraft #42-3718, which failed to return from a bombing mission over enemy occupied territory on 21st January 1944. The above named casualties were reported on OQIG Forms 371, as Missing in Action on the date cited above. The aircraft was observed to burst into flames at 1500 hours on the day of the mission over Heuringhem, France. It dropped out of formation and lost altitude. It was last seen in the target area heading toward the channel. Aircraft was believed damaged by intense heavy flak which was encountered in the target area.

Six (6) of the crew members Lt Charles L. Lee, T/Sgt Carter J. Lunsford, T/Sgt Albert J. Redwine, S/Sgt Walton W. Beach, S/Sgt Frank P. Bongiovanni and S/Sgt Dick (WHL) Chin who parachuted safely were taken prisoners of war by the enemy and later returned to U.S. Military control.

SUBJECT: Non-Recoverable Remains

Lunsford and S/Sgt Beach, stated that Lieutenants Baughart, Fabian and Schwankl did not bail out of their damaged plane when it crashed. Sgt Lunsford was also informed by a German interrogation officer at Dulag Luft that their plane exploded in mid-air and crashed. Those remaining of the crew that were prisoners were the only ones that got out. Sgt Lunsford also said that the plane was in a critical condition and it blew up shortly after he jumped. No one left the plane after he bailed out and Sgt Lunsford assumed that if any one was left in the plane, he must have perished. Lt Lee stated those who bailed out landed withing four (4) or five (5) miles of each other and information given to him by the tail gunner was that he saw a ball of flame falling from the ship approximately two or three minutes after he bailed out. His opinion was that it was the bombardier, and also the ship exploded over the channel and went down. The full load of 500 lbs. demolition bombs being salvoed at approximately five hundred feet.

German Dulag KU 605 records report the downing of subject aircraft on 21 January 1944, west of Wissant in the sea, with six of the crew members taken prisoners of war and a seventh (7) as dead.

The remains of one (1) of the crew members were recovered from a civilian cemetery at Marquise, France and evacuated as Unknown X-692. The identification of the remains was established as S/Sgt Phillip J. Marizaldi, they were reburied USMC St Andre, France.

Field Investigation conducted on 21 February 1947, revealed the fact that no records exist of a plane crash in the area of Heuringhem-Blandecques or Campagne-Wardrecque on 21 January 1944. At Marquise, where the remains of one (1) crew member was recovered, it was learned that the remains had been brought by German troops from the village of Wissant on the English Channel. Further investigation at Wissant revealed that local residence knew nothing of the recovery of remains or of any Allied plane crash on 21st January 1944. Attempts to associate unknown remains of American deceased and washed ashore cases recovered from the coastal areas of Wissant and the general vicinity of Heuringhem with subject casualties proved negative.

In view of the facts and statements submitted it can only be concluded that Lt Clyde J. Baughart, Lt Elmer W. Schankl and Lt Paul K. Fabian were killed in their aircraft and crashed with the plane into the English Channel, and their remains have never washed ashore, but rest with the wreckage in an unrecorded place which precludes recovery.

Investigating officer contacted the Gendarmerie of Arques and found that there was no record of a plane crash in the area of Heuringhem-Blandecques or Campagne-Wardrecque on 21 January 1944, the date on which B-17 #42-37818 was lost.

The Mairie of Marquise was then contacted and it was learned from the Mayor's records that the body of S/3gt Phillip Marizzaldi was brought to the Marquise Cemetery by the Germans for burial. At this time they stated that it had been picked up at Wissant, a small village on the Channel coast.

Investigator accompanied the Commander of the Gendarmerie Brigade of Marquise to the village of Wissant and found that no inhabitants in that town had any knowledge of how or where the Germans had located the body of Marizzaldi nor did they know of any planes which crashed in that area on 21 January 1944. The Gendarmerie records at Marquise also show no plane crashes, in their area on 21 January 1944.

It is believed that the plane in question may have fallen in the Channel and the body of Marizzaldi washed up on the shore where it was found by German troops. More definite information on the plane crash could probably be secured by contacting the six members of this crew who have returned to the United States.

SUBJECT: Reports of Death

1. The following named officers of the 568th Bombardment Squadron, 390th Bombardment Group (H), were reported missing in action on 21 January 1944, in the European Area, in flying pay status, by Casualty Message Number 033124-1-C, dated 2 February 1944 (AG 704).

They were continued in the status of missing in action on 22 January 1945, and were presumed dead on 17 September 1945, by SR&D case numbers 1974 and 1974-A, respectively, under the provisions of Section 5, of the Missing Persons Act, as amended.

2. Missing Air Crew Report Number 2270, dated 23 January 1944, reports that subject personnel and seven others of the 568th Bombardment Squadron, 390th Bombardment Group (H), constituted the crew of B-17G type aircraft, number 42-37818, which failed to return from a bombing mission on 21 January 1944. The aircraft was reported to have been sighted over Heuringhem, France, at 1500 hours on the day of the mission. Weather conditions and visibility were reported as "5/10 Stratocumulus, tops 7000 feet, but clear over target". Attached to the "Missing Air Crew Report" is the following extract from an S-2 Mission Report regarding subject aircraft, dated 23 January 1944:

"A/C 818 was observed in target area, at about 1500 hours, to burst into flames during second bomb run. It dropped out of formation and lost altitude. It was last seen in the target area heading toward the channel. A/C believed damaged by intense heavy flak which was encountered in target area."

Casualty questionnaires were mailed to the returned crew members upon their evacuation to the United States, concerning the fate and disappearance of subject personnel. Questionnaires were returned by Lieutenant Lee and Sergeants Lunsford and Beach in which they stated that Lieutenants Baughar, Fabian and Schwankl did not bail out of their damaged plane when it crashed. Sergeant Lunsford was also informed by a German interrogation officer at Dulag Luft that their plane exploded in midair and crashed. Those remaining of the crew that were prisoners were the only ones that got out. Sergeant Lunsford also said that the plane was in a critical condition and it blew up shortly after he jumped. No one left the plane after he bailed out and Sergeant Lunsford assumed that if any one was left in the plane, he must have perished.

3. Examination of the AG 201 and the Casualty Section files of the subject personnel fails to disclose any information pertaining to their disappearance not hereinbefore set forth. A report received from the Memorial Division, Office of the Quartermaster General, states that no record of burial for subject officers has been received in that office. Captured German records report the downing of subject aircraft on 21 January 1944, west of Wissant in the sea, with six of the crew members taken as prisoners of war and a seventh as dead.

4. Subject officers and seven others constituted the crew of a B-17 type aircraft, number 42-37818, which failed to return from a bombing mission over enemy occupied territory on 21 January 1944. The plane was observed to burst into flames at 1500 hours on the day of the mission over Houringham, France. The seven crew members whose status is not herein considered have been reported as prisoners of war or killed in action. Since the plane was aflame in the target area and was heading toward the channel when last seen, it is logical to conclude that it crashed into the English Channel with subject personnel aboard. This is substantiated by the captured German records which reported the downing of subject aircraft, west of Wissant in the sea. Wissant, France is on the English Channel coastline. Statements from returned crew members indicate that subject officers did not bail out

of their damaged plane, and it is concluded that they perished when it crashed into the English Channel. More than five years have now elapsed since Lieutenants Baughar, Fabian and Schwankl have been reported missing in action, over four years since the cessation of hostilities, during which time no word or any information has been received from any source, to indicate that they are alive.

5. It is recommended, therefore, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act, the foregoing information be accepted as an official report of death, and that a casualty report be initiated stating that subject officers named in paragraph one, were killed in action, while in flying pay status, on 21 January 1944, when their plane crashed into the English Channel, due to enemy antiaircraft fire. The systemat will be processed in accordance with Paragraph 2b, Operations Bulletin 35, 1945. The casualty report and official report of death will include the following statement:

Finding of Death has been issued previously under Section 5, Public Law 490, 7 March 1942, as amended, showing presumed date of death as 17 September 1945. This "Report of Death" is issued in accordance with Section 9 of said Act and its effect on prior payments and settlements is as provided in Section 9.

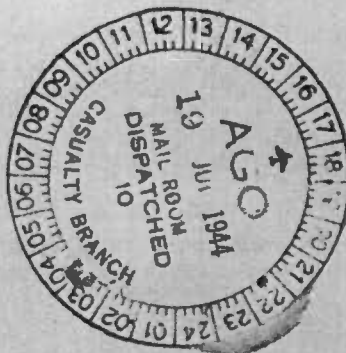

Reference is made to your letter of 11 June 1944 in which you requested information regarding your son, Second Lieutenant Paul K. Fabian who has been missing in action in the European Area since 21 January 1944.

Information is now available from the Air Adjutant General that Lieutenant Fabian was a crew member of a B-17 (Flying Fortress) which departed from England on a bombardment mission to France on 21 January. Full details are not available; however, your son's bomber was seen to leave the formation and to lose altitude, after having sustained damage from enemy antiaircraft fire. This occurred in the target area and when last seen, Lieutenant Fabian's plane was headed toward the English Channel. The crew members of other planes were unable to make further observations, therefore there is no further information available at the present time.

A copy of your letter is being referred to the Chief, Memorial Branch, Office of the Quartermaster General, Washington 25, D. C., with reference to your inquiry regarding the personal effects of your son.

You may be assured that the military authorities are constantly endeavoring to ascertain the whereabouts of our missing personnel and when information is received relative to Lieutenant Fabian, you will be communicated with promptly.


