ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target:

BREMEN, GERMANY

2. Commitments:

The 401st Group furnished the complete 36 A/C 94th "B" Group. Two PFF A/C were furnished in the lead squadron, and one in each of the other two. A spare accompanied the lead and high Squadrons.

3. Flight Over England:

a. Takeoff:

As briefed, all A/C took off successfully.

b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

Squadron assembled quickly and were fully formed 15 minutes prior to briefed departure time from Cottesmore. Individual squadron formations very good. Group formation fair with low squadron lagging slightly.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)

3. c. Route Over England:

As briefed, until just before division assembly line. At this point there was interference between the 1st CBW and the 94th CBW because the briefed approaches of the two wings to CP # 1 crossed. However CP # 1 was crossed out on course with the wings and the groups within the wing in their proper order in the division column.

4. Attack:

a. Flight to Target:

As briefed, until turn before the IP. Since the "Mickey" set in the group lead ship was occasionally erratic, the squadrons were instructed to make individual runs so as not to waste all the group's bombs in case the "Mickey" should go out on the bomb run. Then the lead "Mickey" set went out completely and the deputy was instructed to take over the lead of that squadron. In changing positions one turn was missed, but the deputy then hit the IP squarely and made a good bomb run.

b. Bombing Run:

Squadrons bombed individually. All of them made straight PFF bomb runs, with no visual assistance over 10/10's clouds. The 3 runs were reported as "good runs" by the Mickey operators. The leaders all salvoed. The balance used a minimum intervalometer setting. There were no equipment failures reported. Results were unobserved.

c. Flight from Target:

After the target the squadrons were rallied and the deputy of the lead squadron lead the group out. Finally upon reaching Gee Box range of England the group leader resumed the lead and lead the group back to England.

d. Return to Base:

Upon reaching the base over the undercast was found to be solid, so the squadrons were kept together for a SOP instrument let down on the buncher. All ships landed safely at home base.

e. Weather:

Weather was described as 10/10's enroute, low clouds, tops approximately 10,000 feet. Same condition prevailed over target and on return.

f. Fighter Support:

Fighter support was good.

g. Comments on formation and Interval:

Formation unusually good. Groups were in very close interval in the division column.

4. h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

Recommend approach of various CBW to division assembly line be planned so that they do not cross at the same altitude.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

All scheduled A/C attacked.

6. Enemy Opposition:

No enemy air opposition seen or encountered. (see Flak Report for flak)

7. Battle Damage:

10. Bombing Data:

a. Observations:

Due to complete undercast results were unobserved. Mickey Operators report target appeared very well and a good run made.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the secondary target, dropping 495 X 100# M47A2 bombs. A/C 931 returned 1 IB which hung up. The spare A/C returned 42 IB's to base.

Low Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the secondary target, dropping 501 X 100# M47A2 bombs.

High Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the secondary target, dropping 499 X 100# M47A2 bombs. The spare A/C returned 42 bombs to base.


TRACK CHART


