Dear Mr. Lukowitz:

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The Department of the army desires that you be informed of the final determination in the investigation of the case of your brother, the late Staff Sergeant Stanley Lukowitz, Jr.

Realizing that this is a matter of great importance to you, may I review the pertiment facts of the case as revealed by Department of Army records and reports received from our overseas command.

The records of this office disclose that your brother was one of ten crew members manifested aboard the B-17 Aircraft Number 42-30401 which failed to return from a bombing mission to Obersleven, Germany, on 28 July 1943. According to information in cur files, your brother's plane was attacked over the northwest coast of Germany, and it is believed that, after being attacked, it flew farther north and crashed in the North Sea, on the west coast of Denmark. This surmise is based upon the fact that the remains of three crew members were recovered from the west coast of Denmark, where they had been washed ashore. The remains of these three were initially interred on Bomo Island, Denmark, and were later removed to a United States Military Cemetery overseas. There is no evidence, however, that the remains of your son or those of his other six comrades were ever recovered.

In order to determine whether the remains of your brother had been washed aphore and buried in an isolated location, a thorough search was made of the entire coast of Denmark, but no information leading to the location of his remains was uncovered. During these searches, identifying data pertaining to your brother were compared with all identifying data for unidentified remains recovered from iono Ialand, but this comparison also failed to reveal any remains which could be identified as those of your brother. After a detailed study of the negative results of the investigations and the pertinent facts regarding the case, the Department of the Army has been forced to conclude that the remains of your brother are not recoverable. I wish to assure you that, should any additional evidence come to our attention indicating that his remains are in our possession, you will be informed immediately.

Permit me to extend my deepest sympathy in the loss of your loved one and express the hope that you will receive some small measure of solace from the knowledge that he died in the service of his country.

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

Thank you for the information furnished in your letter of June 30 regarding your brother, Staff Sergeant Stanley Lukowitz.

Sergeant Lukowitz's personal property which was received at the Army Effects Bureau was forwarded to you by parcel -ost on / July 31.

My action in forwarding this property does not, of itself, vest title in you. I transmit these items only that you may act as gratuitous bailee in caring for them until the return of the owner. In the event he is later reported a casualty, and I sincerely hope he never is, it will be necessary that the property be turned over to the person or persons legally entitled to receive the same.

Then you have received the package, I will appreciate your signing one copy of the inclosed receipt, indicating that you will act in the capacity stated, and returning it to this Bureau.

Your cooperation in this matter will be most helpful to us. For your convenience, there is inclosed an addressed envelope which requires no postage.

Pastor JORGENSON was naturally very desirous of getting acurate information concerning the deccased buried in his cometery and exchanged some correspondence with the father of Lt. MARSHALL HERRICK. I was unable to find out if the first letter was sent by Mr. HERLICK to the Pastor, or vice versa. However, in one of his letters, Mr. HERRICK mentioned the fact, that one of Lt. MARSHALL HERRICK's crew mates (Lt. STEPHEN HETTRICK) was also buried in the KIRKLEY cemetery as proven by a letter from the War Department of which he sent him a copy.

12 May 1948

Pastor JORGENSON showed me this copy and made a transcription of it for this investigation (see copy, Incl # 3). This letter, dated 1 August 1947, from the office of the Quartermaster General, Washington D.C. is an answer signed by Lt. Col. BANKNIGHT of the Lemorial Division, to incuiries by the father of Lt. STEPHEN HETTRICK, It says, in substance, that according to the records of AGRC, ETO, the remains of Lt. STEPHEN HETTRICK have been recovered and interred in the cemetery at ROMO, Denmark.

To the knowledge of the undersigned investigator, the records of AGRC, European Area do not indicate that Lt. STEPHEN HETTRICK is buried in ROMO. The records of the U.S. deceased in Denmark have been checked carefully by this investigator for this and other investigations, and, as mentioned above, according to the records, as established after the disinterments and identifications of 1947, the situation on ROMO is as follows: Three (3) identified deceased (MARSHALL HERRICK, NIX and DEFFANDALL) and one (1) unknown (1F-3135, in grave No. 905).

It is therefore evident that a mistake has been made by the person preparing the answer for Lt. Col. BANKNIGHT's signature. This mistake probably originated in the fact that MACR # 139 contains two names which can be confused (Lt. HETTRICK and Lt. HERRICK) and that <u>2nd Lt. MARSHALL</u> <u>HERRICK</u> is listed on AGRC records as buried in ROMO Churchyard.

However, as a result of this mistake, Mr. HETTRICK, Lt. ST THEN HETTRICK's father, believes that his son is buried in ROMO Churchyard and so, writes to the Pastor to obtain nore information. (It is to be noted that the letter from the War Department does not give a grave number

to the supposed grave of Lt. HETTRICK). As a proof of his statement, Mr. HETTRICK sent the Pastor a copy of the War Department letter.

Thus, the Pastor was placed in the following situation: Originally, the cemetery contained four (4) American deceased of whom one (1) was identified (Lt. MARSHALL HERRICK) and three (3) unknowns. As a result of AGRC investigation and a grave-side processing, two (2) of these unknowns have been identified and Pastor HORGENSON knew the names of these two (2) (NIX and DEFFANDALL) even before they were officially listed as such by the CIP, AGRC, This is probably due to unofficial statements of the identification teams at the time of disinterments. However, here was one (1) unknown who was still unidentified (Grave No. 905) and there was an official letter stating that a concertain Lt. STEPHEN HETTIICK was buried on ROMO Island. So the Pastor assumed that the letter referred to the last remaining unknown in the cemetery (IF-3135) and that Unknown IF-3135 had been identified, by some means unknown to him, as Lt. STEPHEN HETTRICK.

Pastor JORGENSON was so sure of this, that, when the day before my visit to ROMO, the disinterring team made arrangements by telephone to have the graves opened, Pastor JORGENSON said "But grave 905 is not unknown anymore. It is Lt. HETTRICK and I have a letter from father to prove it."

I asked Pastor JORGENSON, at the time of the burial, before any identification by AGRC, he had any reason to identify this unknown as Lt. STEPHEN HETTRICK. He stated that all he knew about him was what is recorded in the cemetery register:

> "Unknown Flyer, buried 19 August 1943, grave No. 905 buried by the German Army Chaplain from SILT (Germany) 74RNACK one fold ring, lighter (Thomas) Switzerland On the right foot: a woman's shoe

and thus that he had no proof of this identity, but believed it, however, to be correct, for the deceased was buried three days after MARSHALL HERRICK and was therefore presumed

to be one of his crew mates. (See statement of Pastor, Incl. #2).

The woman's shoe referred to, is possibly a high heeled riding boot of Wastern (Camboy) such as were sometimes worn by U.S. army Officers.

I also asked the Pletor to live me an extract of the cenetery register, with the original entries of the time of the burials (See Incl. # 4) and went to the Churchyard of KIRKEBY where the disinterments of the four (4) deceased were taking place.

As stated in the narrative of disinterment (see extract, Incl. # 5), <u>rave 385</u> reported to be that of Lt. MARSHALL HERRICK had never been opened before. Clues of nationality were numerous. Clues of identity included the complete set of teeth and a 2nd Lt.'s ber. This definitely eliminates the possibility that the deceased could be STEPHEN HETTRICK, who was a lst Lt.; and it confirms that it is MARSHALL HERRICK, who was a cnd Lt. Besides this is further confirmed by the fact that the name MARSHALL HERRICK was given by the Germans and they certainly could not give that name if they had not seen it on the deceased.

<u>Grave Nc. 905</u> (see extract of narrative of disinterment), (Incl. #6), contained badly decomposed remains. This action of decomposition is due to exposure to the air of the remains during the exhumations and identification operations mentioned above. However, no trace of the PE reported in the cenetery register (ring, Swiss lighter, woran's shoe) was found in the grave. With the remains was found a burial bottle, left by the previous exhumation team, which contained a copy of the GRS Form # 1 (report of burial) attached to the case records. This form (see extract, If.cl. # 7) lives the heigth as 6 fact, the weight as 170 lbs, and the hair as auburn. It also states that the deceased is "believed to be a member of MACR # 129, as he was washed ashore three days after HERRICK, L.MEHALL, who is identified and buried in same cemetery".

(c) That, although no records of AGRC substantiate this assertion, the father of Lt. STEPHEN HETTRICK was informed by an official letter from the War Department that his son was buried on ROMO Island.

(d) That, because of this War Department letter, Pastor JORGENSON, in charge of the KIRKEBY cenetery, ROMO, assumed that this Lt. STEPHEN HETTRICK, whose name he heard for the first time from the WD letter, could be none other than the Unknown 1F-3135.

(e) That the investigation concerning Uninown 1F-3135 shows that he was probably a crew member listed on MACR # 139.

(f) That, consequently, it is quite possible that the Pastor's guess is right and that there is the possibility that Unknown 1F-3135 is in fact 1st Lt. STEPHEN HERRICK.

(a) That the records concerning 1F-3135 show that this deceased had a height of 6 feet, a weight of 170 Lts. and had auburn hair. It is further revealed that the Germans listed as his personal effects: a gold ring, a Thorens Swiss lighter and something on the right foot described as a "woman's shoe" which was probably a high heeled ridingboot of Wastern cow-boy type", a type which would have been unknown to the Germans.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended by this investigator that the remains of the four (4) American deceased proviously buried in KIRFEBY centery, ROMO, Denmark, which remains have been evacuated to U.S. Military Chetary, Neuvillo-en-Controz, Balaium on 11 Lay 1948, be carefully processed by CIP technicians and that the remains of Unknown 1F-.135 be given special check for the purpose of ascertaining if they can, or cannot be associated with the deceased 1st Lt. STEPHEN W. HETTRICK, 0-412115.
