

Dear Mr. Andersen:

The people of the United States, through the Congress have authorized the disinterment and final burial of the heroic dead of World War II. The Quarter-aster General of the Army has been entrusted with this sacred responsibility to the honored dead. The records of the War Department indicate that you may be the nearest relative of the above-named deceased, who gave his life in the service of his country.

The enclosed pamphlets, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," and "American Cometeries," explain the disposition, options and services made available to you by your Government. If you are the next of kin according to the line of kinship as set forth in the enclosed pamphlet, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," you are invited to express your wishes as to the disposition of the remains of the deceased by completing Part I of the enclosed form "Request for Disposition of Remains." Should you desire to relinquish your rights to the next in line of kinship, please complete Part II of the enclosed form. If you are not the next of kin, please complete Part III of the enclosed form.

If you should elect Option 2, it is advised that no funeral arrangements or other personal arrangements be made until you are further notified by this office.

Will you please complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail in the enclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, within 30 days after its receipt by you? Its prompt return will avoid unnecessary delays.

Dear Mr. Anderson:

Your letter concerning your son, the late Captain Charles J. Anderson, has been received in this office.

The War Department has now been authorized to remove the remains of our honored dead, at Government expense, to the final resting place which next of kin may designate.

When the necessary verification of records has been completed, a letter with an information pamphlet and a "Request for Disposition" form attached will be mailed to you. The "Request for Disposition" form, when properly filled out, will constitute the formal expression of your detailed desires as next of kin. Until you receive these forms, therefore, it will not be necessary for you to communicate with this office regarding this subject, unless you desire to report any change of address.

As you probably know, the supply of steel for the manufacture of caskets, is at present uncertain. Without this essential item, the projected movement of remains cannot properly be initiated. This fact and the necessity for complete coordination of movement in many parts of the world make it impossible, at this time, to estimate when the mentioned forms will be mailed. Every effort, however, will be made to shorten the time between now and the date of mailing, and your desires will be acted upon with a minimum of delay.



Dear Mr. Andersen:

Acknowledgment is made of your letter requesting information regarding the burial location of the remains of your son, the late Captain Charles J. Andersen.

At the outbreak of the war it became necessary to adopt the policy that the remains of our American dead overseas should not be returned to the United States until after the cessation of hostilities.

Now that Japan has been defeated immediate plans are being formulated with a view to returning to the next of kin the remains of their loved ones. This sacred duty will be carried out by the Government at its expense and insofar as practicable in accordance with the expressed wishes of the legal next of kin, who will be notified well in advance of the actual return of the remains. The mission as a whole is world wide in scope and of necessity time consuming, but you may rest assured that this office fully appreciates your desires and will do everything in its power to fulfill them at the earliest possible date.

The official report of interment shows that the remains of your son were interred in the U. S. Military Cemetery, Margraten, Holland, Plot U. Row 6, Grave 137. With reference to other larger cities the approximate location of Margraten is twelve miles northwest of Aachen, Germany and eight miles southeast of Maastricht, Holland.

This office regrets sincerely, the delay in enswering your letter and wishes to extend its deepest sympathy in the loss of your son.

Dear Sir:

I am taking this occasion to write you with respect to the personal effects of my deceased son, Captain Charles J. Andersen, who was killed in action on March 21, 1945. being, at that time, a member of the 668th Bomb. Squadron, 416th Bomb Group (L), and at this time again wish to express my appreciation for the sympathy extended by you to me.

I have received the effects of my son from the Kansas City office, but, on examination, find they comprise nothing but his clothing. In some of his last letters to us, he stated that he had a great number of pictures which he would forward to us as soon as he had time to index them. It is not his clothing I am interested in as much as I am in these pictures, as well as correspondence, address books and other such items which are the real personal effects of any individual and which would be of extreme value to us. assume that his watch and ring were burned up in the accident so that they are not available, and am not interested in his camera, but I am taking this opportunity to ask if some effort cannot be made to secure for us the personal items mentioned.

I know that it is difficult to administer the handling of individual effects during the war, but am of the belief that his comrades would not deliberately deprive us of such Items as would have no value to anyone else other than his parents, and if there is any manner in which you can be of assistance to us to secure such items, you can rest assured that it will be highly appreciated.

All the rest, residue and remainder of amy estate, of whatsover kind and nature, and wheresoever situated, be it real, personal or mixed, whether now owned or herafter acquired, I hereby give, devise and bequeath unto my Father CHARLES J. ANDERSEN absolutely; but if he should predecease me, that I give, devise and bequeath all my property herein before mentioned to my Mother FLORA LINA ANDERSEN absolutely.

ITEM III. I nominate, constitute and appoint my Father CHARLES J.
