SYNOPSIS OF CASE: On 21 June 1944, a B-17 with a crew of 10 men, was lost en route from Gender Lake, Newfoundland, to Preswick, Scotland. Careful examination of all radio logs for 21 June at the Canadian and Scottish ends of the run, revealed that no contact was made with the plane after it took off. All available agencies took up the search for this aircraft. This search included the British Isles and the Ocean route presumably followed by the aircraft. To date no further information has been received regarding plane or any of its crew members.

Reference is made to 4th Indorsement signed by Lt. Col. McCall.

- 2. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in U.S. Military Cometeries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.
- 3. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared unrecoverable.

- 1. On or about 21 June 1943, B-17 #42-30254 of the 385th Bb Sq, 550th Bb Gp was lost while enroute from Gander Lake, Newfoundland to Prestwick, Scotland.
- 2. After a careful examination of all radio logs for 21 June 1943 it was established that no contact was made with the ship after the take-off.
- 3. A complete search of the British Isles and the ocean route presumably followed was made for the aircraft but no trace of it or its crew was found.
 - 4. MARIO has no information in their records on the ship.

"according c-17 #42-30254 our M/T communication with him very indefinite and no /T contact whatsoever was made pd Appears quite possible that this ship is in same category as Fortress 229"

- 2. After careful examination of all radio logs for 21st June, no entry appears in these logs indicating that contact was ever established with 5-17 ,42-30254, which was perating under the E/T call signe "Jobey A", and it is further borne out in the radio logs that no contact was made on U/T. However, the station radio operator stated that at 0903 he thought he heard Jobey A broadcastin, he was approaching the field, but this later developed to be Tobey 2. Due to the similarity of the two call signs it can be regdily understood how this error could occur.
- 3/ Reference paragraph 4. all agencies at our disposal were brought to bear in the search for this aircraft, including a complete search of the critish Isles and the ocean route presume ly followed by the aircraft.
- 4. To date, no further information has been received regarding this aircraft or its crew members.

Thank you for the information given in recent letter written by Miss Betty Meyers, in connection with disposal of the effects of your son, Staff Sergeant Morris Meyers.

There is inclosed check for \$3.35, which represents the only property of Sergeant Meyers received at the Army Effects Bureau to date. These funds were received by mail from overseas. Since money is ordinarily transmitted in advance of other property, it is possible that additional belongings of your son will arrive at a later date, and the information you have furnished will enable us to make prompt shipment of such property.

With reference to details concerning the death of your son, I suggest you contact The Adjutant General, Washington 25, D. C., as that officer has jurisdiction over the handling of such matters. You, of course, realize that it is not always possible to receive detailed information during times of war.

My action in sending this check does not of itself vest title in you. These funds are transmitted only in order that some responsible person receive them so that distribution may be made in accordance with the laws of the state of your son's legal residence.
