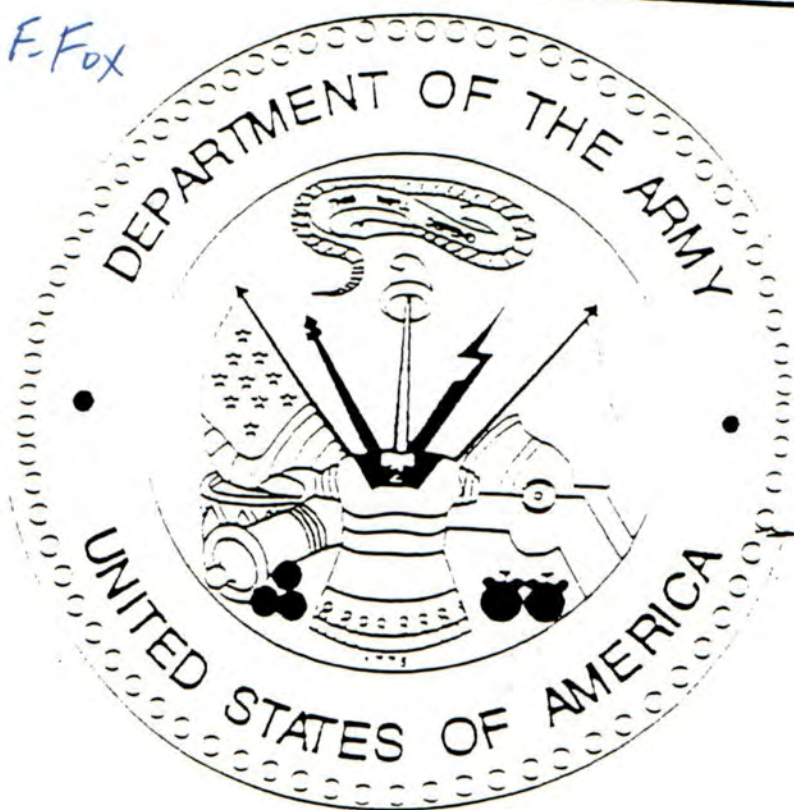

## EXTRACT

AG 704 - Dead (10 Oct 44)

Page Two.

b. A map attached to the Missing Air Crew Report shows the course of the flight from the base to the target, and return, but does not indicate a spot where the plane was last seen, contacted or went down.

c. A classified message from the Commanding General, U.S. Service of Supply in the European Theater of Operations, No. C 87362, dated 26 August 1944, Casualty Branch No. 240003, states that there is no additional information available regarding the crew of the plane piloted by Lieutenant Herber Carquevillr.

\* \* \* \* \*

11. The AG 201 files and Casualty Branch files of these officers and enlisted men were examined thoroughly and were found to contain no information of value in this review, other than that set forth herein.

12. In response to requests from this office for any information in their files pertaining to the status of these officers and enlisted men, the Memorial Division, OCMG, and the Prisoner of War Division, PWGO, reported they had no records, and in the cases of the officers; the Officers' Branch, AGO, could furnish no further information.

13. None of the records or reports received show these officers and enlisted men to be prisoners of war, internees, or returned to duty.

## II. - CONCLUSIONS

1. On 9 October 1943, planes of the 8th Air Force took off for a heavy bombardment mission to enemy installations at Anklam, Germany. On the way to the target, the route followed was east over Denmark and close to the southern part of Sweden, then south to the target. The return route followed the same general pattern. A number of the planes on the mission were damaged by anti-aircraft fire over the target or by the intercepting enemy fighter planes and went down. The officers and enlisted men with whom this review is concerned were crew members on seven of these planes.

5. There is no information available regarding the loss of the plane flown by Crew No. 4. It was not seen to go down, and all personnel aboard are still carried in the status of missing in action.

9. A period of twelve months has elapsed since the officers and enlisted men with whom this review is concerned became missing in action. During this time 10 members of their crews have been reported as dead and 9 as prisoners of war. One of the enlisted men carried as a prisoner was not officially reported. However, he wrote a card to his family stating that he was a prisoner.

10. In view of the facts and circumstances set forth in the preceding paragraphs, it appears that these officers and enlisted men may not reasonably be presumed to be living.

### III. - RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that findings of death be made as of 10 October 1944, under the provisions of Section 5, Public Law 490, 7 March 1942, as amended, in the cases of the twenty officers and thirty-one enlisted men named on the attached list entitled "Army Air Forces personnel missing in action following a bombing raid on Anklam, Germany, 9 October 1943".


The purpose of the board was to determine the non-recoverability status of certain casualties now under the jurisdiction of this command.





SYNOPSIS OF CASE: The above men comprised the entire crew of B-17-F aircraft #42-3180 which on 9 October 1943 departed from Ridgewell, England on a combat mission to Anklam, Germany. No information is available as to where this plane was last seen or under what circumstances. It is believed that the plane was damaged by anti-aircraft fire or by interception by enemy fighter planes and went down in the NORTH SEA.

Reference is made to MACR # 888; OQMG Form 371 for CARQUEVILLE, Herbert 1/Lt O-735045 and CUNNINGHAM, Thomas J, 2nd Lt. O-677188.

2. All attached supporting documents recopied from records in file Headquarters American Graves Registration Command.

3. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.

coast of Holland at approximately 1400 hours on the day of this mission. (KU 212, 13, 14, 15). Allied historical records for World War II show that a force of 115 B-17's, or "Fortresses", struck at Anklam in this daylight mission, meeting strong fighter resistance over the target, and losing at least seven planes.

5. A report dated 27 August 1948, received from the Memorial Division, OQMG (Mr. Long), states that no burial reports for subject personnel are of record, also, that no unidentified deceased of record can be favorably associated with any of the crew. The report further states that the missing crew is being processed as "Non-Recoverable" by the Review Board. A careful examination of subjects' 201 files and other available source material has not disclosed any further information of interest to this review.

6. The crew of plane No. 42-3180 participated in a heavy daylight attack, launched 9 October 1943 from well dispersed fields in the British Isles, on Anklam, Germany. No evidence is at hand to show whether the missing crew heard "bombs away" before they died. No doubt it was impossible to maintain a check on the individual planes in such an armada. A study of losses suffered from other missions over Europe has proved that planes may even go down over the North Sea on their return trip without it being known at the time that they had reached the target. It is known that in the fall of 1943 the Germans maintained complete and accurate records on allied planes forced down in the North European area under their control. Whether this plane exploded, crashed and burned, or lies at the bottom of some body of water, it seems certain that all of the crew perished with the plane, since most of the route lay near well-populated land masses, and the temporary survival of any should have been observed and long ago reported. The Baltic Sea is well dotted with islands inhabited by fishermen, in the area covered by the scheduled route, and it seems unlikely that a plane could have broken up in that stretch of water without some of the bodies having been washed ashore, whereas many planes are known to have gone down in the North Sea without leaving a trace. It is noted that a minimum of four unidentified B-17's are known to have been shot down off the coast of Holland on the most likely route for a disabled plane to have taken back. The only reasonable conclusion is that the plane concerned was forced down with the loss of all hands, in the North Sea, either at the beginning of the flight, or, more likely, when limping home after having been damaged by enemy action.

7. It is recommended, therefore, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 9, Missing Persons Act, the foregoing information be accepted as an official report of death, and that a casualty report be initiated stating that the Air Corps personnel listed in paragraph 1 above were killed in action on 9 October 1943 over the North Sea, in flying pay status. The systemat will be processed in accordance with Paragraph 2b, Operations Bulletin 35, 1945. The casualty report and official report of death will include the following statement:

Following continued absence for a year, the above-named members of the 533rd Bombardment Squadron, 381st Bombardment Group, were presumed dead as of 10 October 1944, under provisions of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act, as amended.

2. Missing Air Crew Report No. 888, dated 10 October 1943, shows that the personnel named above comprised the crew of B-17F aircraft No. 42-3180, missing as the result of a combat mission flown from Ridgewell, England, to Anklam, Germany, on 9 October 1943. Weather was reported to have been clear. The plane was not sighted after take-off (which, although the exact time is not shown, apparently occurred at about 1100 hours, according to data found in the records of other planes on the same mission.). A sketch attached to the report shows that the route included a 350 mile flight over the North Sea, thence east across the Danish peninsula, from Esbjerg to Odense, thence southwest across the Danish islands in the Baltic Sea to the German coast, north of Rostock, and on to the target. The return route by-passed Rostock on the north again, but recrossed the Danish peninsula further south, near Flensburg on the German border.

4. None of the crew were ever reported as captured, interned, or deceased. Translations of captured German records on file in this office do contain reference to four unidentified "Fortresses" seen to fall off the


The property, contained in one carton, is being forwarded and should reach you in the near future.

When you have received the carton, I shall appreciate it if you will sign one copy of this letter in the space provided, and return it to this Bureau.




