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



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

I am writing to you in reference to your brother who gave his life in the service of his Country during the European conflict.

In an effort to furnish the next of kin with all available details concerning essualties among our personnel, the Army Air Forces recently completed the translation of several volumes of captured German records.

In regard to Staff Sergeant George J. Mislinski, these records indicate that he was killed in action 5 November 1943, when his B-24 (Liberator) bomber crashed at Uedem (51° 40° N, 6° 16° E), Germany, about ten miles southeast of Kleve, Germany. These records further state that on 6 November 1943, his body was interred in the Community Cemetery at Uedem, grave number 33.

The Quartermaster General, in his capacity as Chief, American Graves Registration Service, is charged with the responsibility of notifying the next of kin concerning grave locations of members of the military forces who are killed or die cutside the continental limits of the United States. The Quartermaster General will furnish you with definite information of your brother's buriel location, should this information be received from the Commanding General of the Theater concerned.

May the knowledge of your brother's valuable contribution to our cause sustain you in your bereavement.


