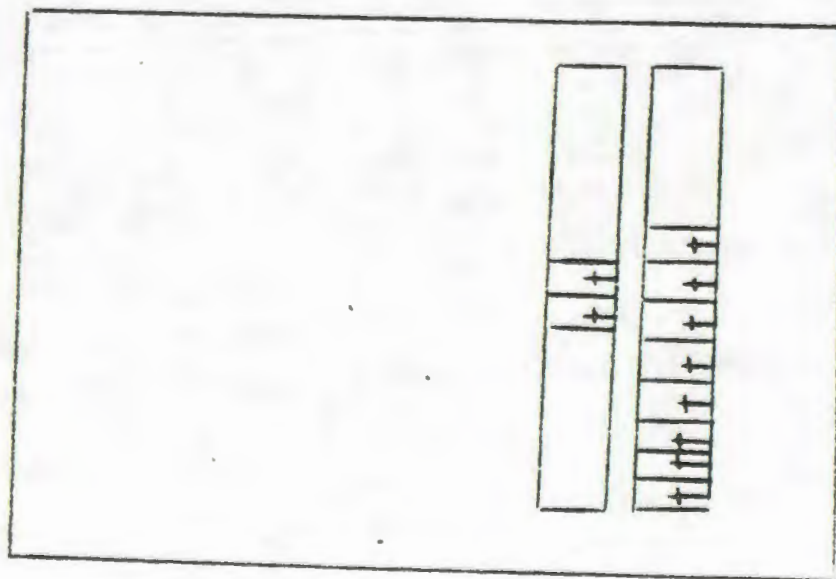
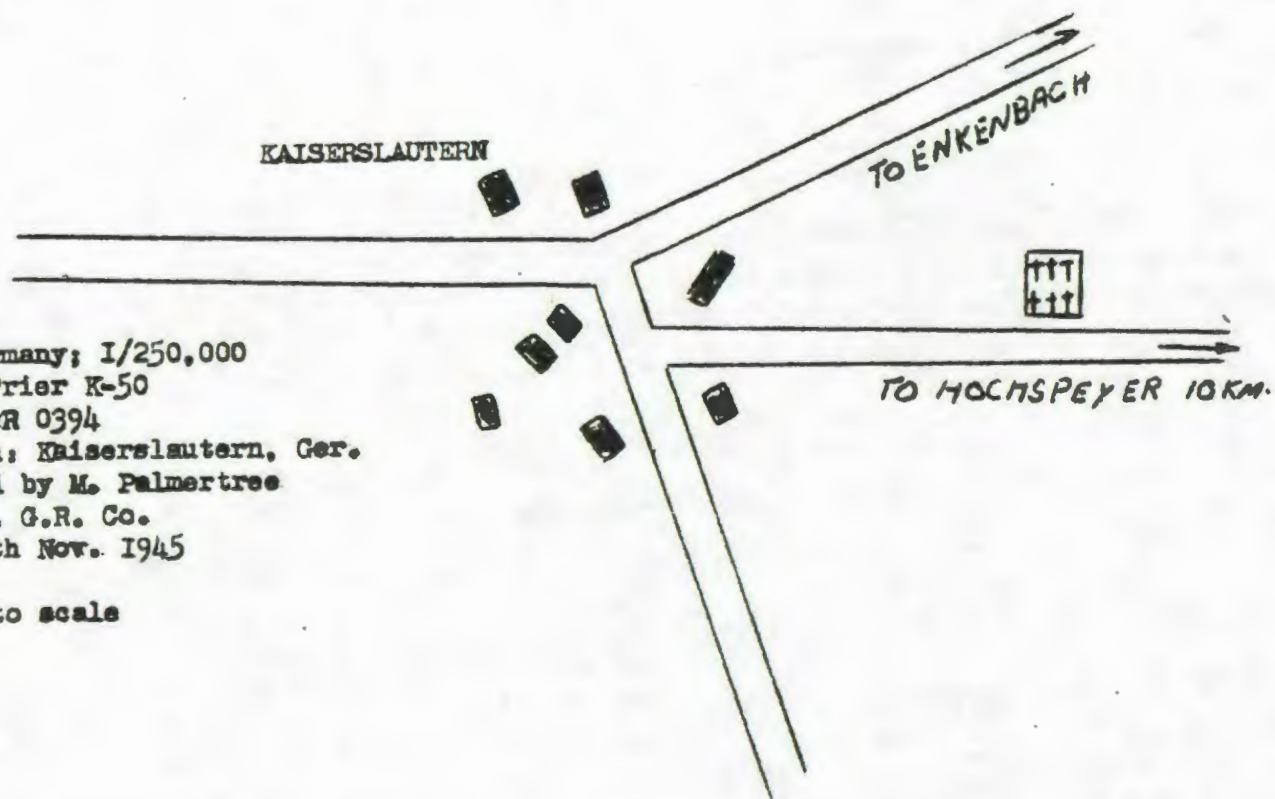

Dear Mrs. Barrett:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

While interments are in progress, the cemetery will not be open to visitors. You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave-site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.

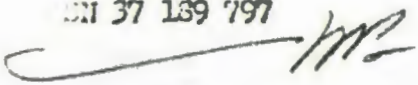

Your letter and the "Request for Disposition of Remains" form pertaining to the remains of your son, the late Technical Sergeant Elia E. Owen, have come to my attention.

I am gratified to inform you that the Department of the Army will comply with your desire to have the remains of your son rest in a permanent United States Military Cemetery overseas.

All necessary arrangements for burial, military honors and religious services will be completed and provided by the Government. Please rest assured that although you have no responsibilities, every detail will be accomplished with all the reverence and dignity traditional for our honored dead.

You will receive notification of the exact location of the grave. The flag used to drape the casket of your son during the burial ceremony will also be sent to you.

After all final interments are completed in permanent overseas American Military Cemeteries, the cemeteries will be relinquished to the control of the American Battle Monuments Commission for beautification and permanent care. It is not contemplated that photographs will be made available for distribution prior to that time. The exact date for such transfer of custody cannot be stated at the present time. However, at the time you receive notification of the final interment, it is suggested that you contact the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington, D. C., and make your wishes known.

Dear Mrs. Owen:

I am writing you relative to the previous letter from this office in which you were regretfully informed that a Finding of Death had been made in the case of your husband, Technical Sergeant Gla E. Owen, 37,189,777, Air Corps, and that the presumptive date of his death had been established as 11 April 1945.

The records of the Department of the Army are being amended to show that Sergeant Owen was killed in action on 29 January 1944 in Kaiserslautern, Germany. This change in status from presumed dead to killed in action is based on burial information recently received. You will receive a letter from The Quartermaster General concerning the disposition of your husband's remains.

Pursuant to the provisions of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, 7 March 1942, as amended, official reports will now be issued by the Department of the Army which will indicate the actual date of his death as that shown above. The issuance of this official Report of Death will not affect any payment or settlement of accounts which has been made on the basis of the Finding of Death.

I am writing you relative to the previous letter from this office in which you were regrettably informed that a Finding of Death had been made in the case of your brother, Technical Sergeant GLa E. Owen, 37,139,797, Air Corps, and that the presumptive date of his death had been established as 11 April 1945.

The records of the Department of the Army are being amended to show that Sergeant Owen was killed in action on 29 January 1944 in Kaiserslautern, Germany. This change in status from presumed dead to killed in action is based on burial information recently received. You will receive a letter from The Quartermaster General concerning the disposition of your brother's remains.

Pursuant to the provisions of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, 7 March 1942, as amended, official reports will now be issued by the Department of the Army which will indicate the actual date of his death as that shown above. The issuance of this official Report of Death will not affect any payment or settlement of accounts which has been made on the basis of the Finding of Death.

My continued sympathy is with you in the great loss you have sustained.

Dear Mrs. Barrett:

I am writing to you with reference to your son, the late Technical Sergeant Ola E. Owen.

The remains were recovered by personnel of the American Graves Registration Service from the Civilian Cemetery at Kaiserslautern, Germany. As identification could not be established at that time, an Unknown designation was assigned pending further investigation, and interment was made in Plot 2H, Row 6, Grave 61, in the United States Military Cemetery Saint Avold, located twenty-three miles east of Metz, France.

The investigation which has been conducted in an effort to identify his remains is now complete and the identification has been established. I regret that it was not possible to furnish you with this information sooner, however, I feel sure that you realize the necessity of first completing the investigation. With the identification established, the remains have been casketed and are being held in above ground storage pending instructions from the next of kin regarding final interment, either in a permanent United States Military Cemetery overseas or for return to the United States.

Pursuant to authority granted under Public Law 368, 80th Congress, the Secretary of the Army has established the order of precedence among relatives eligible to direct final disposition of a decedent's remains. Accordingly, the widow has prior disposition authority unless she was separated, divorced or has remarried. In either of these events the right of disposition automatically reverts to the parents, the father having precedence over the mother.

Inasmuch as proof of the remarriage of your son's widow has been received in this office, we are inclosing informational pamphlets regarding the Return of World War II Dead Program, including a Disposition Form on which you may indicate your desires in this matter. Upon receipt of the properly completed form, you may be assured that the Department of the Army will attempt to comply with your instructions as indicated thereon.

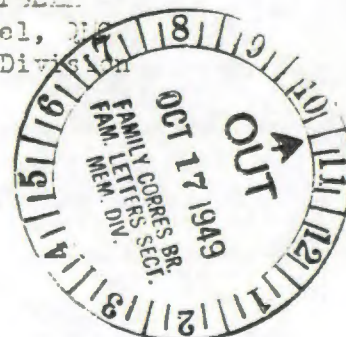

1. On 29 January 1944, A/C # 42-30231 crashed in the vicinity of KAISERSLAUTERN, Germany.
2. Of the ten crewmembers, the MACH lists six crew members as being killed and four RMS.
3. To date, two of the deceased have been recovered and interred as KNOWN in USMC - St. Avoird.
4. These four cases, X-3117, 3118, 3123 and 3124 account for the remaining deceased crew members, until now held in an unresolved casualty status.

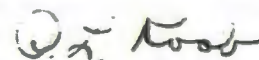
It will be appreciated if you also will kindly furnish the following information, and any other which you may consider important:
