Under the provisions of AR 600_45, as amended, and pursuant to authority contained in cable No. 9782, Headquarters NATOUSA, 5 December 1943, and Circular No. 26, Headquarters NATOUSA, 6 March 1944, the **Sold**ier's Medal is awarded the following named personnel, residence and citation as indicated:

JOHN E. ABDALLAH, 0-733505, First Lieutenant, Air Coros, 340th Bombardment Squadron, 97th Bombardment Group, United States Army. For heroism at great risk of life and beyond the call of duty. On 16 July 1943, after a forced landing at sea caused from damages to his aircraft by intense anti-aircraft fire during a combat mission over northern Italy, Lieutenant Abdallah, although painfully wounded, assisted the crew into rafts. Noticing that the navigator was missing, he returned to the ramidly sinkingairplane, entered it, and found the navigator there in a semiconscious condition. Desoite his own wounds and the fact that the aircraft was nearly under water, Lieutenant Abdallah brought the injured crew member out of the sinking plane in time to save his life, even though the plane sank within one and one-half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ minutes. By his selfless courage and herosim, together with his cool judgement and devotion to duty at a time of great danger, Lieutenant Abdallah has reflected great credit upon himself and the Armed Forces of the United States of America.
