Dear Mrs. Kemper:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

While interments are in progress, the cemetery will not be open to visitors. You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave-site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.



Dear Mr. and Mrs. Kemper:

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Kemper:

I am now at liberty to advise you that the identification of your son's remains has been established. I sincerely regret that it was not possible to furnish you this information earlier. Realizing that it has been difficult for you to understand how so long a period of time can elapse before satisfactory results are obtained, I feel that you should be informed of the circumstances and the evidence upon which the identification is based.

As you know, Harold's plane crashed on 22 February 1944 near Lieders, Germany, with a loss of the entire crew of ten. The names of your son and some of the crew, and two deceased listed as "Unknown" were included on the Official German report of the crash. The report stated that the instruments were intact in the American civilian aircraft, but slightly broken.

The remains now identified as those of your son were among those recovered by personnel of the American Identification Service from the above burial location. The identification of these dead was accomplished by means of their identification tags; however, no tags were found for Harold or the remaining crew members. The remains were, therefore, assigned unknown designations pending further investigation, and interred in the United States Military Cemetery Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium. It is not unusual to find identification tags missing upon disinterment, as it was customary for the Germans to remove these, where possible, for recycling and reuse in their war efforts.

At present, all efforts are being made to contact and to reacquaint ourselves with all other possible authorities, to obtain identification of the remaining deceased as established. With

particular reference to your son, I regret, sincerely, the necessity of informing you that, due to the condition of these remains, a dental chart could not be accomplished, nor could physical characteristics be ascertained with any degree of accuracy. Although identification could not be established through dental and physical comparison, in view of the fact that all other members of this crew are now identified, by circumstantial evidence, the remains previously designated Unknown A-1468 have been identified as the remains of your son. All records will be changed to read: "2/Sgt. Arnold J. Kemper"

There are inclosed informational pamphlets regarding the Return of War or Dead Program, including a Disposition Form on which you may indicate your desires in this matter. Upon receipt of the properly completed form, you can be assured that the Department of Defense will attempt to comply with your instructions as indicated thereon.

In order that we may take immediate action toward the final disposition of the remains of your son, it is urged that you complete the inclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail it to this office, without delay, in the inclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage.

It is felt sincere regret that it has been impossible to less than 100% identify these remains. That they will be delivered with small urns from which remains may be scattered in an honored fashion in the service of this country.



Mr. Postlethwait told me that Mrs. Kemper was considerably worried lest the two unknowns we report in our letter of 3 October 49 were German civilians. Mr. Postlethwait told me that it is evident that she had a complete misunderstanding of our letter.
				3. I gave Mr. Postlethwait a complete summary of the facts as indicated in the 293 file as well as the IBS from Identification Branch dated 19 December 1949. I told him that the ten decedents of this plane were buried in a common grave under an oak tree in the Middlesex Civilian Cemetery. I further informed him that since nine of the decedents were individually identified, the tenth decedent could be no other but Harold C. Kemper. I explained to Mr. Postlethwait that we could not identify the remains of Kemper from physical characteristics (teeth or otherwise) since the remains were in a condition which did not allow for a comparison with Army medical records.
				4. Mr. Postlethwait advised me that he quite well understood that our identification was made necessary by circumstances under which we identified the ten decedents. Dear Mr. Berger:

Reference is made to our recent telephone conversation in which you were advised that you would receive a letter furnished you with additional information concerning your son, the late Captain Edward W. Tucker.

In the immediate following, we will do what we can. Our son was born October 21, 1918, at the village of Kavakli, Turkey. The official records of that date show no individuals in town, except of whom were listed by name and were listed as "Unknown". His "Unknown" designation seems to indicate that there was no record or he could not be determined by the Germans. He originally did not crash in our town, but 2 kilometers northeast of Kavakli, near Kozlu, and there is no record of any fatalities from the vicinity of the crash. The German members of the station, in a number too great to name, the only survivors interred in Kavakli.

On the date of his death, he was serving in the 1st and 2nd Company, 2nd Battalion, 1st Regiment, 10th Division. The date is 12 June 1944. Your son was serving as a gunner in a 105mm gun crew, so it is difficult to be furnish exact details. However, as the first divisional unit, they often will not be available now and we are unable to furnish details.

As to the condition of the remains identified as those of your son, a dental chart could not be accomplished, nor could physical characteristics be ascertained with any degree of certainty. Although identification could not be established through dental and physical, it does not mean that all or even some of this crew had been previously identified, by other stations where are the process of elimination, and remains were found to be unknown. Please see the attached for further details of your son.

At present, which is information given to us by the station of our son's unit, no officer with personal responsibility, has a right to make a claim, and since we will be doing the same thing, we are verifying

the identification of the remains of your son, and that all information pertaining to him has been carefully checked and reviewed.

The "Request for Disposition of Ashes" form was forwarded to you in our letter dated 3 October 1947, on which it was requested that you record your detailed desires for the final interment, here or abroad, of the remains of your loved one. It is vitally essential that your decision be recorded with our office at the earliest possible time, to enable us to reserve the necessary grave space in the national cemetery of your choice or otherwise comply with your detailed desires.

Your cooperation in this matter will be greatly appreciated, and if you believe our office can assist you further in any way, please feel free to communicate with us at your convenience.

On October 3, 1944 you wrote to Mr. and Mrs. Herbert H. Kemper (Mr. Herbert H. Kemper is dead) Tolu, Kentucky, concerning the disposition of the remains of their son, Harold J. Kemper, who was killed in action in a plane crash on Feb. 12, 1944 near Hiddesen, Germany, and also you made an attempt recently to reach the Kempters by telephone concerning the same matter. Mrs. Herbert H. Kemper lives a distance from Marion, and she has placed her letter in my hands for the purpose of writing an answer to your office.

Mrs. Kemper is disturbed over disposition of the remains of their son for the reason that she is not able to clearly understand your letter of October 3rd in that you say in paragraph 2 of that letter that the entire crew of ten of the plane of which Harold was a crew member was killed, and two deceased listed unknown were included on the official German report of the crash, and you further state that interments were made in the Hiddesen civilian cemetery in a single grave. From the reading of this paragraph Mrs. Kemper and her son, James H. Kemper, both were talking to me, and they gather the idea that all ten of the crew members of the plane were killed, and in addition two other persons were also killed in this crash, probably German soldiers or German civilians, as the plane may have fallen in the town and killed these two other persons by the crash, and they feel that probably these ten crew members, together with these two deceased persons listed as unknown, were all buried in a single grave.

Mrs. Kemper is now worried over the fact that there is a possibility that when our men undertook to recover these bodies some two or three years later, that there is a possibility that the body of Harold J. Kemper could have gotten mixed up with these two deceased unknown persons, and that there is a probability that even if she would request that you send the body of her son here for burial that she could never be definitely sure that it is the actual body of her son.

Mrs. Kemper tells me that she is anxious to have the body of her son returned to her home in Livingston County, Kentucky and there buried, but that she is distressed over the possibility of having a body sent which might not be that of her son, and she is asking you to hold this case in abeyance until you can, if possible, clear up some of the questions which have arisen in her mind, and which are set forth in this letter.

We have some idea of the difficult task which your Department is endeavoring to perform in returning the bodies of these soldier boys to their parents, and we also hope that you will understand the fears and doubts that naturally arise in the minds of these parents wondering if they are receiving the body of their own son.

We hope that you will be able to help Mrs. Kemper in some way, but at the same time we can understand that this is a most difficult case, probably impossible of solving to a point that all doubts will be cleared away, but we know that your department will do the best possible under the circumstances.

May I request that you send your answer directly to Mrs. Hertert H. Kemper, Tolu, Kentucky, and if you care, you may send a copy to the undersigned.

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Kemper:

I am now at liberty to advise you that the identification of your son's remains has been established. I sincerely regret that it was not possible to furnish you this information earlier. Realizing that it has been difficult for you to understand how so long a period of time can elapse before satisfactory results are attained, I feel that you should be informed of the circumstances and the evidence upon which the identification is based.

As you know, Harold's plane crashed on 22 February 1944 near Hiddesen, Germany, with a loss of the entire crew of ten. The names of your son and some of the crew, and two deceased listed "Unknown" were included on the Official German report of the crash. I am now at liberty to advise you that the identification of your son's remains has been established. I sincerely regret that it was not possible to furnish you this information earlier. Realizing that it has been difficult for you to understand how so long a period of time can elapse before satisfactory results are attained, I feel that you should be informed of the circumstances and the evidence upon which the identification is based.

As you know, Harold's plane crashed on 22 February 1944 near Hiddesen, Germany, with a loss of the entire crew of ten. The names of your son and some of the crew, and two deceased listed "Unknown" were included on the Official German report of the crash. The report further stated that interments were made in the Hiddesen civilian cemetery, in a single grave.

The remains now identified as those of your son were among those recovered by personnel of the American Graves Registration Service from the above burial location. 



It is with reluctance that I write to you about your son, S/Sgt Harold C. Zemper, ASN 35495091, who was killed in action 22 February 1944.

In the combat areas it was sometimes difficult, if not impossible, to definitely identify members of our Armed Forces.

We have been forwarded to this office a burial form from another serviceman, with certain identifying information which shows the remains are those of your son. A dental chart which shows several fillings. Available dental records show that the work was accomplished for him by Dr. [unclear] of Topeka, Kansas. The dental chart submitted with the remains shows that the upper teeth, lower right, were extracted.

I will be of the greatest value to this office if you can furnish information as to whether or not your son has ever had this information on his dental chart. Also if you can obtain from the civilian dentist, who treated your son, a copy of the chart which is usually retained by him as a matter of record, and which shows work performed for each patient. Any records available will be of great assistance.

Dear Mrs. Kemper:

I am writing to you in reference to your son who gave his life in the service of his country during the European conflict.

In an effort to furnish the next of kin with all available details concerning casualties among our personnel, the Army Air Forces recently completed the translation of several volumes of captured German records.

In regard to your son, Technical Sergeant Harold Kemper, these records indicate that he was killed 22 February 1944, when the B-17 ("Flying Fortress") in which he was flying crashed at Hiddensee, (52° 30' N, 12° 5' E) Prussia. These records further state that he was interred in the Community Cemetery, in a single grave, on the Island of Hiddensee, 25 February 1944, 5:30 p.m.

The Quartermaster General in his capacity as Chief, American Graves Registration Service, is charged with the responsibility of notifying the legal next of kin concerning grave locations of members of the military forces who are killed or die outside the continental limits of the United States. If the report of your son's burial has not been confirmed and you have not been notified by the Quartermaster General, that official will furnish you definite information immediately upon receipt of the official report of interment from the Commanding General of the Theater concerned.

May the knowledge of your son's valuable contribution to our cause sustain you in your bereavement.

Your letter, concerning your son, the late Technical Sergeant Harold C. Kemper, has been received in this office.

The official German burial report, received in this office through the agency of the International Committee Red Cross, Geneva, Switzerland, indicates that the remains of your son were interred in the Community Cemetery, Muedesem, Germany. When this reported burial has been verified by the American Graves Registration Service, and your son's remains have been removed to an established American cemetery, you will be advised.

The War Department anticipates that, in the near future, authority will be granted to return at Government expense, the remains of those who died overseas to a final resting place as selected by the next of kin. Upon receipt of such authority, the War Department, through this office, will furnish full information to the proper next of kin and solicit their desires. It should be realized that this mission, as a whole, is world-wide in scope and of necessity time-consuming, but you may rest assured that this office fully appreciates your desires, and will do everything in its power to fulfill them at the earliest possible date.



If, by any chance, the property has not reached you at the expiration of thirty days from this date, please notify me and tracer will be instituted.


