SUBJECT: Comments of Crews Participating in Mission to LUXEMBOURG, 9 May 1944.

TO : Commanding Officer, 401st Bombardment Group (H), APO 557 US Army
(Thru Lt Col Voorhees and Lt Col Brooks).

1. Lt Col William T. Seawell, Wing Leader, stated the Wing as a whole flew an excellent formation today. This comment was seconded by most airplane commanders, all of whom complimented Lt Col Seawell on his excellent job of leading the Wing. Most Navigators praised the excellent job done by the Wing Lead Navigator. Lt Harold L. Knopman, Observer, flying with Lt Col Seawell, noted particularly the efficiency with which Capt Ralph W. Dempsey, flying Pilot for Lt Col Seawell, handled his entire crew and the business like manner in which the responds.

2. Lt George E. West, Pilot A/C 7487, complimented Lt John R. Tanner who led the 612th Squadron for his excellent leading.

3. Lt Stephen Wysocki, Pilot A/C 1069, thought that the second element of the lead Squadron was too far back most of the time. This airplane commander observed that the traffic pattern was much better today.

4. Lt George E. West, Pilot A/C 7487, stated that his crew was held up for transportation to the briefing room; they were parked at hard-stand 15,16, & 17.

5. S/Sgt Lawrence F. Brennan (LWG) A/C 1077, complains that it is difficult to throw chaff out of waist windows and states it caused frost bitten hands.

6. S/Sgt William M. Day., (LWG) A/C 1619, said his crew was not issued enough flak suits and criticized the fact that many flak suits have broken fasteners and are generally in poor condition.

7. S/Sgt Meload C. Joseph (TG) A/C 1496, cannot get any sleep in his barracks because of lights and noise.

8. The crew of Lt Clifford A. Lincoln complained that the Briefing Building Latrine was not clean.

9. Complaints concerning corn beef served for breakfast were made by the crew of Lt Francis J. Toussaint, Pilot A/C 9993. The crew of Lt Harry J. Oehsenhirt, Pilot A/C 7664 and Lt Clinton J. Parr, Pilot A/C 7073, do not like food served by the Combat Mess generally.

The target is a railway marshalling yard. It is in the suburbs of the City and the center part is 2000 yards S of the City. It is bounded by a built up area and industrial type buildings on the N and E and on the S. side by scattered houses and open fields.

This railroad has a working capacity of 1500 cars and is the focal point for iron ore traffic from the surrounding country. The target and its facilities is Y shaped and your MPI is the locomotive sheds or ~~round house~~ in the stem of the Y facing south. 1700 yards long; 500 yds wide and lies on a N-S axis. These locomotive sheds and repair facilities are especially listed as a Strategic Target

The secondary target is also a
marshalling yard located ———
It is situated 1 mi South West of the
junction of 2 large rivers. Again the MPT
is the locomotive sheds & round houses

By destroying any either of these two targets
you will seriously hamper ^{railroad} enemy traffic.

The 41st CBW, are scheduled to bomb
just South of your target. They will fly at 12,000 ft.
+ 83 CBW. are bombing.
