MISSION SUMMARY REPORT

Date 16 February 1945

ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: GELSENKIRCHEN, GERMANY
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished the complete 36 A/C 945h "H" Group. 1 GH A/C was borrowed from the 379th Group for the lead squadron -- 1 PFF A/C was included in each box. The high and low squadrons each had a spare A/C.

3. Flight Over England:

a. Takeoff:

Group lead A/C took off from Kimbolton. All others ships took off from home base. Visibility was approximatly 1000 yards; ceiling was about 300'.

Mission Summary Report (cont'd)

3. b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

Group assembled on Kings Cliff Bunker. The assembly was accomplished quickly and the 36 regular ships were in good formation 10 minutes before the group departed the bunker. There were 2 flying spares.

c. Route Over England:

The group (94th "B") departed the bunker on course and on time. 94th "B" fell in behind 94th "A" on the second leg. A deviation to the right was made on the 3rd leg to avoid a shelf of middle cloud. The Division leader recommended that all groups depart C. P. 1 at briefed 2000', or at 19500'. 94th "B" departed C. P. 1 5 miles north and on time, flying along side of 94th "A", which was to the right of 94th "A".

4. Attack:

a. Flight to Target:

Contrails from C. P. 1 to the target and return were severe and persistent from 20000' to 27000'. Preceding groups left banks of contrails. On the climb to C. P. 2, 94th "A" flew to the right of the Division column and 94th "B" to the left to avoid the contrails. The division ~~KENXEMEXXXK~~ column flew north of briefed course after reaching C. P. 2 to avoid clouds and contrails evidently left by the 3rd Division which preceded ~~the~~ the 1st Division on the same route. "Buckeye" did not get off and no weather information over the target was available. It looked like a visual run might be made and the squadrons uncovered with instructions to drop on the lead squadron, which was to make a GH run with a visual assist, if preceding contrails and ground fog and haze interfered with their visual runs. The high squadron leader was hit about 2 minutes before bombs away and went down in a spiral.

b. Bombing Run:

Lead Squadron:

After the turn off the IP, the approach to the target was covered due to clouds and contrails and the sun reflecting off both. The run was started by GH. Close ~~the~~ the end of the run the bombardier saw some of the bombs of the preceding groups striking the ground, which helped him to locate the target. He made a couple of small corrections but there was scarcely enough time to check closely as contrails again obscured the view. The total bomb run was 13 minutes long. The visual assist for the bombardier lasted about 20 seconds. Results were unobserved. The AFCE was O. K.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)

4. b. Bombing Run (Cont'd):

High Squadron:

Turn was made at the IP as briefed. Enroute to the target two bombs went out of the lead ship and everyone salvoed. About the same instance the lead ship went into a spin as a result of a direct flak burst. Bomb hits were not observed.

Low Squadron:

The low squadron received a call ten minutes prior to reaching IP that bombing would be visual. The turn and uncovering at the IP was as briefed. Due to haze and contrails the run was began on PFF Now and then the bombardier was to identify points enroute to the target. At one point the lead bombardier thought a visual assist possible and took over from the Mickey. Contrails became heavy again and definite corrections were hard to make. Bombs away at 1352 on a mag heading of 181°. AFCE was satisfactory.

c. Flight from Target:

The lead and low squadrons rallied off the target. The high squadron rallied with 94th "A" and did not regain 94th "B" until over the Zuider Zee. 94th "B" let down first 1000 feet and then 2000 feet to avoid contrails and clouds of the preceding groups.

d. Return to Base:

Midway across channel cycle relay advised 94th "A" and 94th "B" that they were being diverted. The group proceeded to Honeybourne, where 25 ships landed. The group lead A/C returned to Kimbolton its home base, other ships effected emergency landings at various fields. A/C 43-38779 with its controls shot out had to be abandoned in the air--its crew bailed out safely and the ship crashed near Bartney. Three A/C failed to return.

e. Weather:

Weather over target was described as 1/10 to 2/10 cloud, much smoke from bombs of preceding groups, heavy ground haze.

f. Fighter Support:

Fighter support was meager. No friendly A/C were observed until over 15 minutes from the target, when a group of P-51's escorting the 2nd Division passed in front of 94th "B".

g. Comments on Formation:

Good. Both squadron leaders were in good position until the high squadron lead was shot down on the bomb run. The low squadron stayed in good formation the entire flight.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)

4. h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

The group air commanders should fly a ship from his own base when a GH mission is scheduled and it is impossible to have the GH ship checked thoroughly by personnel of this. On the instant mission the VHF sets (regular and alternate) were erratic.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

A/C 42-31591 - No credit. Pilot returned when # 3 supercharger went completely out. # 2 wasn't functioning well. Ground check revealed trouble in control mechanism. (Mech)

A/C 4406132 - Credit. Failed to drop bombs when bomb bay doors stuck and couldn't salvo. Had to crank doors to open -- jettisoned bombs. (Mech)

10. Bombing Data:

a. Observations:

Due to intense flak, haze and smoke, bomb falls were short, the lead squadrons' bombs about a mile, and the high and low squadrons' about four miles.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the primary target, dropping 28 X 500# GP and 114 X 500# RDX bombs. A/C 730 had 1 RDX hang up which it returned.

Low Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C of the low box bombed the target dropping 48 X 500# GP and 94 X 500# RDX bombs. The spare returned 12 GP to base.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)10. b. Disposition of Bombs: (Cont'd)

Of the 12 A/C EET eleven bombed the primary target, dropping 53 X 500# GP and 78 X 500# RDX bombs. A/C 132 could not open its bomb bay doors until 30 minutes past the target at which point it jettisoned 1 GP and 11 RDX bombs. Aborting A/C 591 returned 12 RDX bombs to base.




