MISSION SUMMARY REPORT

Date 13 January 1945

ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: MAXIMILLIANSAU, GERMANY (Bridge)
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished the complete 36 A/C 94th "B" Group. One PFF A/C was included in each squadron, and a GH A/C (from 384th Group) was to fly as deputy lead. A spare was to accompany each squadron.

3. Flight Over England:
a. Takeoff:

Normal as briefed. All ships took off without incident.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)

3. b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

The lead ship's airspeed indicator went out over the buncher and the Deputy took over. Otherwise assembly was normal. 94th "B" left Kings Cliff buncher on time, on course with full formation.

c. Route Over England:

Route was briefed, and picked up 94th "A" shortly after departure of Kings Cliff buncher. Route to coast was briefed. At Point "Z" 94th "B" was in proper #6 position in division formation.

4. Attack:

a. Flight to Target:

94th "B" Group departed coast and was in division position until after C. P. 1. A group coming from the South cut in between 94th "A" and 94th "B" and then kept swinging back and forth causing 94th "B" to "S" a great deal in order to stay out of prop wash. Route was then followed more or less as briefed, timings being a bit ahead due to winds. As the IP was reached 94th "B" had to overrun IP to avoid collision with another group coming from right. The group then got back on course to target and made run without interference, the original deputy lead ship bombing in the leader's position.

b. Bombing Run:

Lead Squadron:

The Scouting force announced instrument bombing. However 94th "A" called and said that visual bombing would be possible. 94th "B" group swung wide at the IP to avoid the prop wash of an interfering group. By the time the group leveled out the bombardier had about 94 seconds for a bomb run. The drift was pre-set but the dropping angle was off. Bombs were observed to hit about 1500 feet over. AFCE was set up, but due to prop wash at IP it could not be re-set, hence the run was made manually. All ships salvoed on the leader.

Low Squadron:

The low squadron uncovering for the bomb run as it approached the IP. The lead continued past the IP so in order to avoid cutting the lead out the low squadron continued in trail. The bomb run was good, synchronization excellent. Bombs were observed to hit on the MPI. Bombs were away at 1329, Mag heading of 30°: All aircraft salvoed and the AFCE was okay.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)

4. b. (Cont'd)

High Squadron:

"S"-ing by the lead made it difficult to compute a good drift. At the IP it was decided that the run would be visual. The scouting force previously called and suggested instrument bombing. The lead continued past the IP but the high squadron made the turn as briefed. Synchronization was good and bombs were observed to hit in and around the MPI. The Bomb run was made with the use of C-1. All aircraft salvoed. The high squadron was slightly ahead of the lead at "bombs away" because of the lead squadron's overrunning the IP.

c. Flight from Target:

After the formation turned from target squadrons were somewhat scattered. The high fell into position rather soon but the low squadron failed to do so until after C. P. # 4 -- it flying from the target with 94th "A". Route was almost as briefed. Diversion message was received over Belgium and the group proceeded to assigned diversion field.

d. Return to Base:

Although formation was scattered due to low clouds and visibility all ships landed safely at Woodbridge. A/C 891 with the pilot seriously wounded landed at an emergency airdrome in Belgium, left pilot and returned to Woodbridge.

e. Weather:

Weather was described as 6/10 to the IP gradually clearing until CAVU over target. Non persistant contrails were encountered both enroute and over target.

f. Fighter Support:

Fighter support was good.

g. Comments on Formation:

Formation was good, especially over target. Scattered on return when poor visibility was encountered. Interval between squadrons ^{was} ~~was~~ due to interference of preceding group interval between groups was too close.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

None.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

Low Squadron: A/C 43-37790 - Sortie. #4 turbo supercharger went out en route, and after #1 turbo also ran away at IP, pilot returned.

Lead Squadron:

Bombfall missed assigned MPI by some 2000 feet.

High Squadron:

Excellent bombing, some 95% of bombfall was within 1000 feet of MPI.

Low Squadron:

Excellent bombing, direct hits were made on bridge.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the primary target, dropping 72 X 1000# GP on target. The spare returned 6 GP's to base.

Low Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the primary target, dropping ~~some~~ ^{ET, however only 11 a/c} 1000# GP and 5 X 1000# RDX bombs on target. The spare returned 6 GP's to base. ⁶³
~~9/1790 aborted and returned 6 GP's to base.~~

High Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the primary target dropping 60 X 1000# GP and 12 X 1000# RDX bombs on target. The spare returned 6 RDX bombs to base.



2. Lt. Robert B. Campbell, Pilot A/C 591, reported that a single B-17 aircraft, letters HB-L on fuselage, last two numbers of aircraft being 59, red triangle on tail, flew above our formation and bombed our primary target, his bombs falling within 3 or 5 feet of the nose of A/C 591.
